



FSWC-ZAGLEMBIER SOCIETY SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship Description:

The Friends of Simon Wiesenthal Center for Holocaust Studies (FSWC), in conjunction with the Zaglembier Society, is offering two (2) awards of \$1,800 to recognize students who have a passion for keeping the memories of the Holocaust alive and a strong commitment to Simon Wiesenthal's legacy of promoting education and tolerance. Successful applicants must demonstrate their commitment to Holocaust Studies and Holocaust education in essay format and showcase their involvement with Holocaust Studies and Holocaust education throughout their post-Graduate studies.

Provided By:

The Zaglembier Society is a group of Holocaust Survivors and their children from the province of Zaglembie, Poland. Their legacy is to keep their community alive and pass on their memories and experiences to future generations so that the horrors they witnessed may never be repeated. The Zaglembier Society has organized this scholarship through Friends of Simon Wiesenthal Center for Holocaust Studies, a non-profit human rights organization focused on countering racism, antisemitism, and intolerance.

Scholarship Value:

Two (2) scholarships are available at \$1,800 each.

Eligibility:

This scholarship is open to full-time or part-time students pursuing Holocaust Studies at the post-Graduate level (Masters and PhD). Applications are open for all years of study.

Scholarship eligibility will be based on academic achievements.

Deadline:

One scholarship will be awarded in January 2018, the second in April 2018.

Applications for the January scholarship are due by **December 29th 2017**.

Applications for the April Scholarship are due **March 22nd, 2018**.

Applicants not awarded the January scholarship will be considered for the May scholarship.



How to Apply:

Please send in the following documentation:

- Cover letter introducing yourself, include your contact information
- Undergrad Transcript from each institution attended
- Proof of enrollment in post-Graduate program
- Essay that answers the following (Maximum 1500 words):
 1. Why have you chosen to pursue a post-Graduate degree in Holocaust Studies?
 2. What is your particular area of specialization within the field of Holocaust Studies?
 3. What are your professional and/or academic goals at the completion of your studies?
 4. Why is this scholarship important to you? How will it be used?
- Two (2) academic letters of recommendation

The review committee will meet and interview qualifying candidates to determine who will be awarded the scholarships.
