

Providing Grants – Not Loans –
for up to Six Years of Post-Secondary
Education or Training

WHO WE ARE:

- A 501(c)3 non-profit
- An all-volunteer board providing grants (not loans) to Boothbay Region High School graduates
 - Operating expenses average 5%



WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW:

- Grants are based on an applicant's unmet need as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid
- Qualified applicants may receive grants for up to six academic years, which can include three years at the graduate level
 - Minimum grants are \$500 to ensure BRSAF support
 - BRHS graduates returning to school later in life are eligible

WHAT WE HAVE DONE SINCE OUR BEGINNING:

- 1964: 10 grants given totaling \$3,500
 - 2022-2023: 62 grants given totaling \$435,000
- Average grant for 2022-2023: \$6,500 -34% of unmet financial need
 - In the past eight years 591 grants have been awarded



WHERE SUPPORT FOR GRANTS COMES FROM:

- Donations to the Annual Fund
- Invested Funds (average withdrawal rate of 4%-5%)
