OFFICIAL DIOCESAN NOTICE

As of Monday, March 16th, all Masses have been suspended in our diocese. NO PUBLIC MASSES will take place until AFTER April 14, 2020. This means we will not be having Holy Week or Easter Masses. You can still watch mass via our Facebook livestreaming page: [John Church Riverhead](#).

All masses with a previously arranged intention will be celebrated privately by the parish priests. Confessions will be heard only on an as needed basis; we ask that you please call to arrange a time for us to be in the confessional for you. The sacrament of the sick will be offered to all who request it. During this period of extreme caution and prevention we ask for your prayers and also remind you that this Lent is now a time that has given you a mandated time of isolation, and the absence of activity, social gatherings, etc. What a great opportunity for deepening your prayer life and to engage in spiritual reading. It is also a time to write letters to friends, especially the homebound.

CONSIDER THIS!

Sleep Walk

Sleep is beautiful when it comes at the right time, but embarrassing otherwise. Some people sleep through class. They sleep at meetings. They sleep during concerts. They mean well, but they miss out on important moments of life.

Other people sleep through life in other ways. They are unaware of political issues, unconcerned for the needs of the poor, ignorant of manners, aloof from people seeking their attention. Some people sleep through life, through relationships, and through faith.

Around the world, many people are unaware of Christ. It is as if they are asleep. They live in a darkness outside the light of the good news. They may have some inner sense of goodness, given as a gift from God. But they may not yet have heard the gospel, or had the opportunity to live it in faith.

Through baptism, we have been awakened from our sleep. Christ is our light. The Letter to the Ephesians says, “Brothers and sisters: You were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord.” Baptism has changed our status. We no longer belong to the night. We shine with the light of day.

But this has consequences: “Live as children of light.” Having moved from darkness to light, we now have responsibilities. Let us shake off the sleep that threatens to keep us from being faithful to Christ. Throughout this Lent, let us rise from sleep and live in light.

FAMILY REFLECTION

Last week it was suggested that you examine your reactions, feelings and opinions about the current health crisis. Who knew how fast and far reaching the decisions to shut down and pull in would be?

One question last week was, “If we don’t challenge ourselves to grow spiritually how will we overcome the fears which can easily overtake us?” Has fear overtaken you?

The world is exhibiting great fear as we see stores with empty shelves, people blaming others, hourly updates and the reactions of financial institutions. How do you sort out truth, exaggeration, scare tactics and the future?

Possible answers for our concerns are to pause, pray and follow the protocols we are told by health care professionals. Hoarding, worrying, reacting, and projecting for the future are not the answers. It is interesting that people focus on themselves when there is a crisis instead of realizing the power of working together.

Today’s Readings and Gospel emphasize the need to see, to not be blind to goodness and the works of God. Fear blinds us. It has us become confused and anxious. Place your trust in God.

FOR THIS WEEK: Today’s Responsorial Psalm, Psalm 23, is a good prayer. Why not pray as a family this week as part of your Lent prayer time? Someone can be the prayer leader and all respond as noted below.

Prayer Leader: The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want. Beside restful waters he leads me; he refreshes my soul.

Response: The Lord is my shepherd, there is nothing I shall want.

FAITH DIRECT

You may be aware we have had a way of supporting our Parish through “eGiving” called Faith Direct.
