

FAMILY REFLECTION

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

During our December workshops parents, children and teens were asked to name 5 things that would make a perfect day. It was amazing how many children and teens said spending time with family makes a perfect day! After all these months of being together a lot more than ever, it is wonderful to find out that the gift of family is appreciated. That is a positive result from dealing with the pandemic.

When we think of the Holy Family, we may have an image of perfection. Yes, Jesus is perfect and Mary and Joseph were strengthened by God's grace to be his mother and father. Jesus was human and God. He had parents, he had many of the challenges of growing up including not so perfect relationships, he had all the emotions we experience, and he had responsibilities to his mom and dad. As a son, a lot was expected of him. He lived with his parents until he was an adult so he must have been responsible for caring for them. Parents, it is a good thing to have your child learn household tasks as a member of the family.

Please call or email us if you have questions or requests. The church can easily fit 160 people safely if all wear masks and follow directions. We have automatic temperature machines on the wall as you enter. **If you have been at mass and feel sick or think you have Covid-19 – please let us know as soon as possible.** This will help with contact tracing. May God bless us all.

We can always use extra help cleaning after Mass. If you can help us disinfect after the mass please do so. Many, many thanks to all who are helping each week to disinfect the church after the masses and to those who are helping with the traffic flow in church.

Thank you for your great cooperation and wonderful understanding with regards to the



wearing of masks, taking your temperature and just doing your best to keep us all safe. Let us pray that it will end sometime in our lifetime.

Please remember to get your flu shot and know that the same precautions for the Covid-19 works equally well for the flu and even the common cold. What are these precautions?
