The training programme

ClArb and the ERA Pledge
Young Practitioners
Subcommittee (YPSC)
are pleased to present a
new arbitrator training
programme, the ERA Scholars
programme, to help promote
and increase diversity in
arbitral appointments (the
Programme).

The Programme will provide support to those who are engaged in or starting their career as an arbitrator or who would like to enhance their skills as arbitrator, with a focus on award writing training.

In order to join the
Programme, participants will
first need to apply to the
YPSC to be selected.

Those who are chosen (ERA Scholars) will undertake either the ClArb London's Module 3 Award Writing training course (Module 3 Course), subject to ClArb's entry and completion criteria, or the Accelerated Route to Fellowship (ARF) course if they meet the entry criteria, with a view to accrediting as ClArb Fellows.





What is ClArb?

CIArb is an international centre of excellence for the practice and profession of alternative dispute resolution (ADR).

Our growing membership is based worldwide and supported by an international network of 41 branches.

ClArb provides education and training for arbitrators, mediators and adjudicators. It also acts as a global hub for practitioners, policy makers, academics and those

The ERA Pledge is a global initiative that addresses the underrepresentation of women on international arbitral tribunals.

Its objective is two-fold:
to help female arbitrators
secure more appointments
on an equal opportunity basis
and to improve the profile
and visibility of women in
arbitration more

generally. In just four years of existence, more than 4,400 organisations and individuals have joined the Pledge and committed to its objectives. The YPSC pursues these objectives for the next generation.

Who is eligible to apply for the Programme?

Applications should be made to the YPSC 6 weeks before ClArb's corresponding start dates for its courses. These are set out at Section 7.

Once you have passed this
stage, the YPSC will send
your application to the CIArb
Education and Training Team:

Module 3 Course -

Applicants must either be existing ClArb Members (MClArb), or having 'a minimum of five-years' experience in arbitration, construction adjudication or mediation in a lead/sole

capacity; including settlement agreements, the management of proceedings, and attending hearings which have resulted in the publication of a reasoned award or decision, will be required to obtain MCIArb through CIArb's experienced practitioner route. Once they have done so, candidates will be able to apply for CIArb's Module 2 and have a discount on the Module 3 International Arbitration Award Writing course provided certain conditions are met.

ARF – Applicants must meet the following entry criteria:

They have a minimum of 5
years of practical experience
of international arbitration
either as a representative or
an international arbitrator;

- They have substantial knowledge of the framework of international arbitration;
- They can recognise and evaluate evidence;
- They can significantly
 evaluate and apply the
 principles and requirements
 ofan international arbitration;
- They can noticeably demonstrate practical skill in the carrying out of tasks required in preparing for and progressing an international arbitration.

If candidates meet these criteria, they will receive a discount on ClArb's Accelerated Route to Fellowship in International Arbitration provided certain conditions are met.



What benefits does the Programme provide?

ERA Scholars will have the benefit of a 10% discount on either the Module 3 or ARF course offered by CIArb London.

In the future, we hope also to provide career development workshops for ERA Scholars who become CIArb fellows.

Successful candidates who apply for CIArb fellowship will be offered a 10% discount on the Fellowship Peer Interview.
