

How would I know if my family member/friend is being victimized?

A victim of sexual assault may:

- Report trouble sleeping
- Have a loss of appetite
- Report headaches and/or stomachaches
- Appear withdrawn
- Indicate fear for their safety
- Be more aggressive or angry
- Allow their personal hygiene to deteriorate
- Have episodes of unexplained crying

How can you help?

- Listen, be supportive and patient
- Encourage your loved one to report the abuse
- Report the abuse on their behalf

Reporting Options:

- 1) Speak to any staff member in-person and verbally report the information you have
- 2) Speak to the Pierce County Sheriff's Office and verbally report the information
- 3) Write a letter to the following:

When reporting, it is critical that you can provide as many details as possible including:

- Name of person(s) involved
- Name of witnesses
- A description of when and where the incident occurred and what happened

What is PREA?

The Prison Rape Elimination Act, 2003 (PREA) is a Federal law that was signed into law by President George W. Bush in 2003. The law was created to address the problem of sexual misconduct within confinement facilities.

National PREA standards to prevent, detect, and respond to sexual abuse and sexual harassment were released by the Department of Justice in 2012.

PREA prohibits sexual misconduct in correctional facilities such as prisons, jails, lockups, juvenile facilities, and community confinements.

NDATC has ZERO TOLERANCE for all forms of sexual

conduct between student and staff, volunteers,

contractors, or other inmates.

NDATC will investigate all allegations of sexual misconduct in a fair professional and confidential manner.

All NDATC staff, volunteers, and contractors receive education on our zero-tolerance policy and how to report sexual misconduct.

All victims of sexual assault will be provided medical and mental health care.

Perpetrators of sexual assault will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.

Consensual acts of sex between student and staff does not exist.

Consensual acts of sex between students housed at NDATC is against facility rule
