In 1979 he was elected to a Putnam County Court judgeship which included Surrogate's Court and Family Court duties, followed in 1985 by his election to the New York State Supreme Court where he served until 2003. Judge Hickman gained national attention for presiding over the 1999 defamation suit brought by Stephen Pagonis in Poughkeepsie, New York, against the attorneys for Tawana Brawley. He was a member of the Putnam County, Westchester County, New York State and American Bar Associations, New York State County Judge's Association, Surrogate's Association and Family Court Judges, American Judiciary and New York State Judiciary Sections. He was also a former Secretary of the New York State Bar Association Committee on Unified Bar and former Member of the New York State Bar Association Committee on Professional Ethics.
