
Responses to questions on the Te Mātāwai Request for Proposals released on 8 April 2019

Te Mātāwai received four questions regarding the Requests for Proposals (RFPs) published on 8 April 2019. The responses to these questions are provided below for all interested parties.

Are we able to have a Word copy of the Response Form?

Are providers who have received funding from Te Mātāuru or on one of the Pae Motuhake able to submit a proposal for one of the RFPs?

The RFP is open for proposals from any person or organisation. However, we expect proposals to clearly identify any (actual, potential and/or perceived) conflicts of interest and how those conflicts might be managed. There is a section for this in the Response Form. It would then be for the Panel to evaluate the proposal on its merits and value, including a consideration of the conflict of interests.

Are providers for existing contracts able to submit a proposal for one of the RFPs?

Yes. We are open to organisations holding multiple contracts. However, we expect assurance that applicants provide assurance that they have the capacity to deliver each of the projects. Further, applicants must identify any risks, issues and mitigations to capacity, if there are any.

Are applicants able to have an extension on one of the RFPs?

The deadline for proposals for both RFPs is 3pm on 29 April, and no extensions will be granted.
