

Postoperative Instructions for Closed Nasal Reduction

- This procedure is performed to attempt correction of a recent acquired external nasal deformity.
 The procedure may be done in the office or require a brief general anesthesia. Sometimes,
 the injury may be so severe such that future surgeries are needed to try and correct residual
 deformity.
- 2. Bloody nasal drainage may last for a few days. Use a nasal drip pad as needed.
- 3. A cast may be placed over the nose. Leave it in place. It will be removed one week later.
- 4. There may be splints sutured inside the nose. These are removed 7-14 days after surgery. The nose may be very congested. It will improve with time.
- 5. Do not blow the nose for 2 weeks.
- 6. No strenuous activity for 2 weeks. No contact sports for 6 weeks.
- Antibiotics and pain medications may be prescribed. Advil/Motrin may be taken for pain or fever.
- 8. Sleep with the head elevated in a recliner or on 3-4 pillows for the first week after surgery.
