

Mathematical Development

We will be: We will be learning about the numbers 1 to 10. During our maths sessions we will be counting, adding, subtracting and finding different ways to make each number. We will find the number bonds to 5 by making a whole set into different sized parts such as 3 and 2 equals to 5.

Physical Development

We will be:

Learning to move in a variety of ways with control and skill both indoors and outdoors. We will use large equipment to create our own models, balancing, climbing and holding on very tightly.

Knowledge and Understanding of the World

We will be:

Learning about the locality around school. We will be talking about where we live and how we travel to school and around the city of Leeds. We will look for changes in the natural world as the seasons change into spring.

We will be:

Learning about Bible stories Jesus told. We will see Reverend Dan each week who will lead a short worship time. We will now attend school collective worship times.

Language Development

We will be:

Talking and describing about our family, our likes and dislikes and what we enjoy doing at school and at home. If your child has been out on a visit anywhere, do let us know so that we can celebrate this at 'show and tell' time.

Art and Creative

We will be:

Using collage, paint, printing, drawing and music to express our ideas, have fun and to learn. We will try to display some of our creations around school.

Reading and writing

Please make sure that Reading Books are returned to school every day, and that Reading Record books have been completed. We will be using the stories 'Mrs Armitage on Wheels' and 'Mr Gumpy's Outing' to spark our imagination for writing for a purpose such as lists, labels, tickets and captions.

In our phonics we are learning the last few letter sound correspondences h,b,f,l,j,v,y, so that we can blend these in order to read words, and read words in order to read sentences. Please look at the display in the corridor. There will be more workshops where our approach to teaching reading will be explained.

PARENT NOTICE

We do make full use of the outside area each day. As the weather is colder and wetter it would be very helpful if the children could either wear or bring wellies to school on days when it is wet.

A warm and waterproof coat is essential, and if possible, a spare change of trousers/jogging trousers/tights really helps when the children have been playing in the puddles or moving equipment about to create their own designs.
