



## CONSULTATION WITH CANADIAN PILOT COHORT FOR THE CARNEGIE CLASSIFICATION FOR COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT IN HIGHER EDUCATION (CPC)

### MEETING CONCLUSIONS

The TEFCE team received an invitations from the Canadian Cohort for the Carnegie Classification for Community Engagement in Higher Education to present the TEFCE Toolbox and further support their efforts to support the community engagement agenda in their own specific context.

The Canadian Pilot Cohort (CPC) is a group of sixteen Canadian post-secondary institutions (including McMaster University, Simon Fraser University, University of Alberta, University of British Columbia, Université du Québec and many others) who have agreed to undertake the Carnegie Elective Classification for Community Engagement in Higher Education and to reflect how to adapt the Classification to the Canadian community engagement contexts. In this process the CPC was intrigued to hear how European developments such as the TEFCE Toolbox could inform their reflection process and whether some of the TEFCE lessons learnt could be applied to their contexts

The meeting was attended by **26 participants** from the CPC. Three members of the TEFCE team (Thomas Farnell, Ninoslav Šćukanec Schmidt and Bojana Ćulum Ilić) presented the TEFCE Toolbox and its application at one pilot university (University of Rijeka).

Positive feedback was provided by the meeting participants and some questions were discussed such as how much workload the TEFCE Toolbox involves and how the participative elements of the TEFCE Toolbox are structured (the 'SLIPDOT analysis'). The meeting concluded with the CPC open to continue discussions with the TEFCE team on potential synergies.
