
HOW TO MAKE A HELMET

For a Viking in battle against axes and swords, his helmet was his best friend. The basic model came in metal or leather. Added extras included a spike on top, a neck guard and a nose protector. Unfortunately, those fantastic helmets with horns probably never existed on the battlefield.

YOU'LL MEED:


Card: 1 strip 64 x 3 cm and 2 strips 38 x 3 cm, bubble plastic (with small bubbles) 50 x 20 cm, glue, scissors, marker pen, acrylic metallic paints and brush.








Fit the long card strip around your head. Glue the ends together.






Mark the centres of the other two strips and glue together to form a cross.







Position the ends equally inside the headband. Mark and glue.






Mark and cut out four pieces of bubble plastic 1.5 cm bigger than the spaces between the strips.





Glue to the inside of the card strips.





Paint to look like metal. Use thick blobs of acrylic paint to look like rivets.

Top Tip - Top Tip

You can use shorter strips of card from cereal boxes by sticking two together.
