
## HOW TO DRAW-A-SAUR

Your friends each with an A4 piece of paper, pencils, pens, felt-tips.



Keep your drawings secret and let your imagination go.






Draw a dinosaur head. Fold the paper backwards leaving two small lines to show the next person where to continue drawing.






Pass it to the person on your left for them to draw a neck. Carry on like this and draw in this order: a head, a neck, a body and tail, legs, feet.



Often, dinosaurs are named after the place they are found in or the person who found them, so give yours a suitable name!





Then unfold to reveal the latest dinosaur discovery.
