

We will keep apart from children and adults outside of our bubble.




We will wash and clean out hands lots of times every day!




To keep everyone safe we need to remember to cover our face with a paper tissue if we cough or sneeze – then put the tissue straight in the bin and wash our hands afterwards.






Curriculum

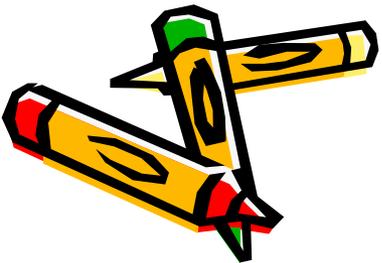



UNIFORM WILL BE REINSTATED IN SEPTEMBER



- Navy P.E. shorts



IMPORTANT: IDENTIFICATION OF CLOTHING AND PROPERTY

Please mark all items of clothing, footwear and other property brought to school with the child's name.
Lost property boxes are located in the school reception.
Children are encouraged to look after their own property in school.



School Uniform (continued)

- **Hair Accessories:** Pupils should wear plain, navy hair bobbles or hair bands. We politely request that your child does not come to school in brightly-coloured, glittery or floral hair bands, bobbles or braids.
- **Jewellery:** Jewellery and nail varnish is not allowed to be worn in school. Pupils may wear a watch and those children with pierced ears may wear stud earrings, although these must be completely removed by the pupil themselves before PE. If your child is unable to remove them alone, please ensure they are taken out before they come to school on PE days.
- **Bags:** Due to the current climate children **SHOULD NOT** bring bags to school. **Pupils will be provided with all of the stationery required; pencil cases and stationery are not required.**





Communication

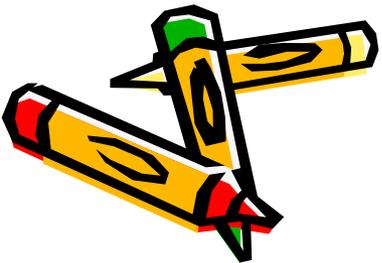
We ask that you do not email staff directly. We are currently evaluating the use of the year group emails. This may be something we continue in the new academic year.




Communication (continued)


School will regularly communicate with parents by email, text message, the school website and Facebook page. We DO NOT use WhatsApp as a method of communication.

Please **park in a safe and considerate** place.





Safeguarding - Attendance

We would like to see all children back in school in September.

In line with our school policy, parents/carers are expected to:

- Ensure their child attends school and arrives on time every day. **You will soon be informed of the start and end time for your child's class bubble. Unfortunately these times are not negotiable as it is necessary to minimise the number of people on the school site at drop off and collection times. This is in line with government and scientific guidance.**
- Promote a good attitude to learning by ensuring their children attend school in the correct uniform
- Not arrange medical and dental appointments in school time wherever possible.
- Telephone to inform the school between 8:15 and 8:45 on the first day of absence for their child.
- Work in partnership with the school and other agencies in the best interests of their child; this includes informing the school about significant influences and changes in the child's life, which may impact on learning, e.g. bereavement.
