

Year 1 Newsletter Summer 1—2018/2019

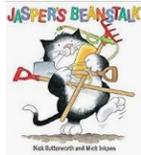
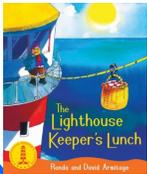
This half term's topic is: Who left the tap on?

In **English** we will be:

- Reading and sequencing sentences from familiar stories.
- Writing instructions.
- Writing descriptions about settings.
- Story mapping and re-telling stories.

Books that we will look at in depth are:

- Jasper's Beanstalk
- The lighthouse Keeper's lunch
- A River



In **Maths** we will be:

- Counting, reading, writing numbers to 100 in numerals **and words**.
- Partitioning numbers to 100 into tens and ones and representing them in different ways.
- Ordering numbers to 100 by value.
- Solving worded problems.
- Recognising coins and adding with money.

In **Science** we will:

- Identify and describe the basic structure of a variety of common trees.
- Identify and name a range of deciduous and evergreen trees.
- Use observations and ideas to suggest answers to questions.
- Gather and record data to help answer questions.
- Perform simple water experiments.

In **R.E.** we will be learning about Judaism. Our main focus question is: Who is Jewish and how do they live?

In **Music** we will be focusing on creating our own songs using our imagination and a range of instruments.

In **Art** we will be studying the works of Claude Monet and other impressionist artists with a focus on water related art.

This half term, **P.E.** will continue to be on a **Monday**.

In **Geography** we will be studying human and physical similarities and differences between the United Kingdom and Madagascar. We will focus on the access to clean water.

In **History** we will be focusing on the life of local engineer John Smeaton. In particular, we will study his work on lighthouses.

In **Computing** we will research technology outside of school and work on pictograms.
