Overall attendance for the 2019-20 school year up to the end of last half term is 97.69%, meaning we are currently on track to meet our target of 97% attendance for the year.

In the last week before half term, 10 classes achieved attendance of 97% or higher and the top 3 classes were:

We will of course have some entertainment from the school choir in the main hall where tea, coffee and cakes will be served throughout the afternoon. Everybody welcome, tickets on sale shortly from the school office at £2.00 per family and these will also be available on the door. All pre-sold tickets will be entered into a prize draw so be sure to buy yours early!



Tickets to see Father Christmas will also go on sale shortly at £2.00 per child. Unfortunately, due to Santa's time restrictions, numbers have to be limited.

This year, there will also be a Christmas Cake-Off Competition, open to all children, staff and parents. Information will be sent home with children next week.

STARTING SCHOOL — Children born between 1 September 2015 and 31 August 2016 are due to start primary school in September 2020. Applications open on 19 November 2019. To apply for a school place, you must apply online by 15 January 2020 at www.calderdale.gov.uk/admissions. If you do not have internet at home, facilities will be available at Calderdale's Customer First Offices in Halifax and also at Calderdale libraries. Assistance with the process can also be sought at the Customer First Offices or on 01422 392617. You may also contact our school office team who will be delighted to help you. If you would like a leaflet about applying for a primary school place, please contact school and register your child's name. The 'Admission to Primary School' booklet 2020 is available on the council [website](#) or can be viewed at your local library or in school. The offer of places will be made on 16 April 2020.
