Challenge #1: Research (15 points)

Challenge #4 Character Study through a fiction novel (25 points)

Choose an interesting character from a fictional book of your choice.

Write a paragraph about that character below. (*Character traits describe a character on the inside and outside.*)

Use the following checklist as a guideline to help you:

- Physical Characteristics-use text to describe what your character looks like. (Physical appearance)
- Personality Characteristics-use text to explain how your character feels/acts/responds to specific situations.
- Character's Emotions: Was there a time when this specific character was upset or extremely happy, or sad, or nervous, etc.? List a few of the emotions he/she had throughout the novel and explain why he/she felt this way. What was happening?
- Does your character change throughout the novel? In the last two boxes, explain how he/she was in the beginnings vs the end of the novel.
