NOTICE OF RACE

(This Notice of Race may be amended from time to time pursuant to RRS 89.2b)

AMENDMENT: July 12, 2019 – 3.6 Entry, 4.1 Fees

The regatta will be organized by Grosse Pointe Yacht Club (GPYC) in conjunction with the U.S. Optimist Dinghy Association (the "USODA"), *collectively* known as the organizing authority.

1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2. "USODA Conditions for Sanctioned Regattas and Championships" will apply and can be found at www.usoda.org.
- 1.3. The following applies to RRS 61:
 - a) The third sentence of RRS 61.1(a) is changed to read, "The flag need not be displayed until she is no longer racing."
 - b) RRS 61.1(a)(2) shall not apply. She shall conspicuously display a red flag. The flag shall be attached to the competitor, clothing or personal flotation device and capable of being concealed and being conspicuously displayed at arm's length.
 - c) The following new rule is added:

61.5 Informing the Race Committee

In addition to meeting the requirements of RRS 61.1, a boat intending to protest another boat concerning an incident in the racing area that she is involved in or sees shall, at the first reasonable opportunity after she finishes, inform the race committee measurement boat at the finishing line of her intent to protest and, when applicable, the identity of the protestee.
- 1.4. Appendix P will apply as changed by the sailing instructions.
- 1.5. A condition of entry and participation in this regatta is the wearing of a U.S. Coast Guard approved personal flotation device (PFD), or for international or for international competitors only, an appropriately sized PFD/buoyancy aid as approved for use in the competitors country of origin. International competitors may be required to self-certify their PFD/buoyancy aid meets the requirements of this section. All PFDs/buoyancy aids shall be properly secured at all times while on the water, except for brief periods while removing or adding clothing. All PFDs must be suitable for the competitor's weight. Wet suits, dry suits, and inflatable PFDs are not approved nor permitted as PFDs. Failure to wear a proper PFD will result in a penalty up to and including disqualification at the discretion of the protest committee. These changes are added to RRS 40, and the Preamble to Part 4 will not apply to RRS 40. **[SP] [DP]**



- 1.6. In all rules governing this championship.
- a) **[DP]** denotes a rule for which the penalty is at the discretion of the protest committee and may be less than disqualification.
 - b) **[NP]** denotes a rule that shall not be grounds for protests by a boat. This changes RRS 60.1(a).
 - c) **[SP]** denotes a rule which a standard penalty may be applied by the race committee without a hearing, or a discretionary penalty applied by the protest committee with a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1 and A5.
- 1.7. The US Sailing prescriptions to RRS 63.2 and 63.4 will not apply.

2. ADVERTISING

- 2.1. Advertising is restricted in accordance with IODA Class rule 2.8.1.
- 2.2. Boats may be required to display sponsor advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority. If this rule is broken World Sailing Regulation 20.9.2 applies. **[DP]**

3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1. The regatta is open to all boats of the International Optimist class.
- 3.2. Eligible boats may enter by completing online registration and paying all entry fees and completing the [USODA Boat Self-Certification Safety Checklist](#), the [USODA Sailor Code of Conduct](#), and the [USODA Measurement Form](#).
- 3.3. The Red, Blue and White Fleet assignments will be based on the competitor's age on the first scheduled day of racing, July 24, 2019.
- 3.4. All competitors shall be members of their respective National Class Association (NCA), such as the USODA, and have been born on or after January 1, 2004. The organizing authority may require satisfactory proof of such membership and age. Competitors who are not USODA members are invited to join the USODA by selecting membership found in the left margin of www.usoda.org. Members of other IODA organizations and NCAs need to email usoda@usoda.org for login ID and password.
- 3.5. Registration must be done on-line at www.usoda.org in the Members Only area accessed via login ID and password. Competitors shall have completed **all** parts of the online registration including completion of the online Waiver and Medical forms in order to be registered for the event. Each competitor shall confirm their registration by checking the entry list on the Event Registration page. If a competitor is not listed on the USODA website, then the competitor is not registered and the late fees in NoR 4 will apply. **Entry Fees are NON-REFUNDABLE and may not be transferred to another USODA event.**
- 3.6. Registration will be closed **Saturday, July 13, 2019 at 6:00 PM EDT.**
- 3.7. Requests to register after the online registration is closed are subject to approval by the organizing authority.

4. FEES

- 4.1. All entry fees shall be paid during online registration at www.usoda.org.
- a) The entry fee is U.S. \$40 if paid by June 27, 2019.
 - b) A late fee of U.S. \$25 (\$65 total) shall be paid for registrations completed June 28, 2019 through **6:00 pm EDT July 13, 2019.**
 - ~~c) An additional late fee of U.S. \$25 (\$90 total) shall be paid for registrations completed July 5 through 12:00 PM EDT July 11, 2019.~~



5. FORMAT OF THE REGATTA

5.1. There is a one-day Girls National Championship and boats will race in a single fleet.

6. SCHEDULE

6.1. Each Sailor shall be present at Check-In. An executed [USODA Boat Self-Certification Safety Checklist](#), [USODA Sailor Code of Conduct](#), and [USODA Measurement Form](#) are required to complete Check-In.

6.2. Continental breakfast and lunch will be provided to competitors on each scheduled race day.

6.4. Five (5) races are scheduled.

7. MEASUREMENT

7.1. Competitors are allowed to use only one hull, dagger board, rudder (with tiller and extension), mast, boom, sprit and sail during the regatta. Substitution of such equipment shall occur only with the written or verbal approval of the Principal Race Officer (PRO).

7.2. Each competitor shall submit a [USODA Measurement Form](#) during the regatta site Check-In. This form shall inform the race committee that all equipment is present and in compliance with Class Rules.

7.3. **Equipment** previously measured and stickered with a USODA measurement decal, and which remains unaltered since that measurement, may be self-certified as part of the measurement process, as long as the measurement stickers are clear and conspicuous. Each competitor shall sign a statement attesting that any previously measured or stamped equipment has not been modified since the date it was measured.

7.4. Equipment not previously measured and approved by the USODA shall meet class measurement requirements prior to being available for use in the regatta, and shall be measured and approved during Measurement.

7.5. **All sails shall be removed from the boom for inspection**, and stamped by a Technical Committee (Measurement) Official (TCO) with the 2019 Nationals signature regardless of previous regatta stamps or signatures.

7.6. The race and/or protest committee reserves the right to inspect or measure equipment and/or sails at any time regardless of whether it has been previously measured.

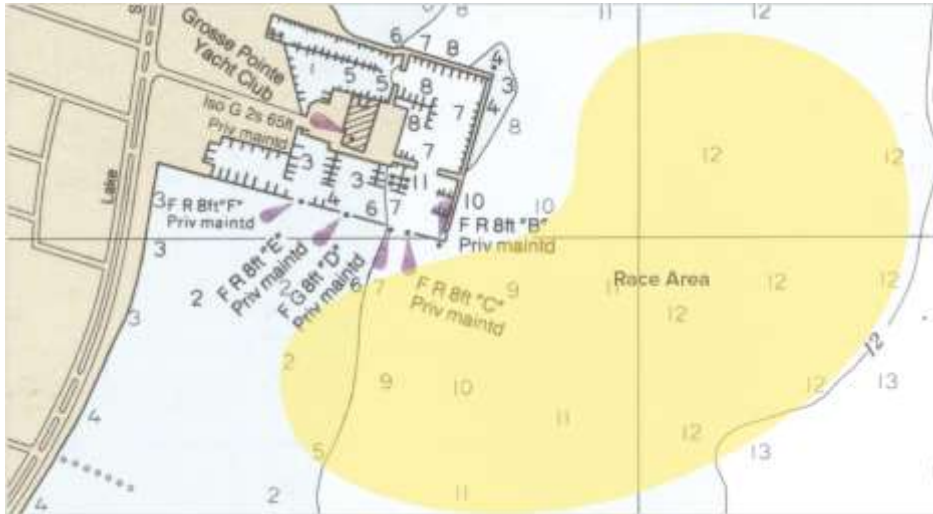


8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available electronically on the USODA website. A printed copy will be posted on the official notice board.

9. VENUE

The racing area will be on Lake St. Clair south of Grosse Pointe Yacht Club.



10. THE COURSES

The courses to be sailed will be included in the sailing instructions.

11. PENALTY SYSTEM

The USODA Graded Penalty System (GPS) will apply. The GPS will be defined in the SI.

12. SCORING

12.1. The number of boats **entered** in the series will be defined as the number of registered boats which subsequently completed competitor Check-In at the regatta venue as referenced in NoR 6.1. This change is added as the first sentence to RRS A2 and A4.2.

12.2. One completed race shall constitute the regatta.

12.3. Scoring based on number of races completed:

- a) When fewer than four (4) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- b) When four (4) or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

13. SAFETY

13.1. Each competitor shall submit a completed [USODA Boat Self-Certification Safety Checklist](#) during the regatta site Check-In. This checklist shall inform the race committee that all equipment is present and in working order.

13.2. Boats may be subject to a safety inspection at any time during the regatta.

13.3. IODA Class Rule 4.2 requires that each competitor shall have "A whistle attached to their personal flotation device at all times while on the water." [SP] [DP]



13.4. Each boat shall have a secure loop in the end of the 8m (26ft 3in) painter. [SP] [DP]

14. ADULT RESPONSIBILITY AND SUPPORT (COACH OR SPECTATOR) VESSELS

- 14.1. All coaches, parents, guardians and ‘designated adults’ are *support persons* (See RRS definition *Support Person*).
- 14.2. In addition to the requirements of RRS 4, an adult (parent, guardian or designated adult) is responsible for the safety of their competitor. It is the responsibility of this adult to decide if their competitor should sail in the weather and sea conditions that might arise during the event. The adults supervising the competitors are ultimately responsible for the risks.
- 14.3. Parents not personally attending any part of the event shall ensure that another adult is authorized and designated to make these decisions for their competitor.
- 14.4. Each competitor shall indicate in writing at Check-In the parent or adult representative that will be responsible for them throughout the event.
- 14.5. The designated adult shall accept full responsibility for all actions of the competitor during any activity related to the event. This includes on-shore activities before, during, and after the regatta.
- 14.6. The organizing authority strongly recommends that each sailor have a support (coach or spectator) vessel on the race course throughout the regatta.
- 14.7. One coach vessel for every seven (7) sailors and fraction thereof from a sailing program may be registered. (For example, a program with eight (8) sailors would be allowed to register two coach vessels.) [DP]
- 14.8. All support vessels shall register during Check-In hours (see NoR 6.3) and promptly display a numbered flag supplied by the organizing authority while on the water. A \$20 security deposit will be required which will be returned at the end of the event with the return of the flag.
- 14.9. Each support vessel shall have a working VHF radio and monitor the radio, an anchor suitable for anchoring in the waiting area, and a basic first aid kit.
- 14.10. The conduct of coaches, parents serving on race committee (including safety patrol), registered support vessels, and all other vessels will be governed by the SI and RRS.
- 14.11. There shall be no unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) drone flight permitted above the racing area, waiting area, corridor, coach/spectator boat zones, start line or finish line.

15. BERTHING

- 15.1. Boats shall be kept in the assigned area located at GPYC. [SP] [DP] [NP]

16. PRIZES

Prizes will be given as follows:

- Overall: 1st through 5th
- Red Fleet: 1st through 3rd
- Blue Fleet: 1st through 3rd
- White Fleet: 1st through 3rd

Perpetual Award – Maggie Wake Trophy

Additional awards and prizes may be presented at the sole discretion of the host and organizing authority and may be based on criteria other than the regatta.



17. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 17.1. Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race.
- 17.2. The organizing authority including the sponsors, the race committee, officers, and board of directors of the GPYC and USODA, and all those involved in these organizations will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta. An online waiver shall be signed by all competitors and their parent/guardian, in accordance with NoR 3.5.
