Essential Job Responsibilities:

Provide cultural activities or personal knowledge and understanding of traditional skills. Apply knowledge of Native American heritage, ideals, and philosophy for developing, maintaining, and enhancing program activities that promote native teachings with general wellness and an enhancement to treatment based on Tribal cultural practices and spirituality to the San Juan Southern Paiute Tribe and other American Indian tribal beneficiaries. Provide health and social issues facing American Indians and Alaska Natives and a desire to promote the delivery of traditional information, programs, and services to reconnect them with their cultures. Utilize professional experience and personal background, demonstrating a firm understanding of Native American traditions and customs and a cultural awareness. Provide Native American traditional healing and how the practice anchors evidence-based practices to foster an empowering and supportive environment, creating a pathway to hope, wellness, and improved quality of life.

Qualifications:

- Preferred qualification, bachelor's degree in American Indian Studies or Behavioral Health or five years of Native American Practitioner specialized experience in the Native American way of life.
- Possess a valid driver's license and background clearance before employment.
- Possess First Aid and CPR Training and Covid-19 Vaccinations.
