
2020 in a nutshell

"If I have learned one thing from this period, it is that people especially have a great need for attention, love, being heard, being recognized...

We now have over 1500 contacts in our WhatsApp file. All people who ask for help in one way or another. And just words like "I understand you" "I really feel sorry for you" "I wish I could do more for you" "Let's do our best to stay positive" turn out to be so healing.

The people who contact me are sometimes so desperate that the tone with which they start a conversation with me is not always very friendly. But as long as I remain patient, understanding and loving, these conversations ALWAYS end in a positive way and that makes my heart happy again... "Thanks for taking time to listen to me" And it can be that simple sometimes."

The Food Waste Program

We distribute food that would normally have been thrown away by supermarkets/wholesalers.

In 2020 it became crystal clear that throwing away food is like stealing from the table of those who are poor and hungry.

The moment the lockdown was announced, our WhatsApp exploded, with requests from people who had lost their jobs right away. Although we couldn't respond immediately, within 2 weeks the foundation was found to be essential help and we could restart distributing food.

Many restaurants, wholesalers, supermarkets were donating their goods, since most of them were not allowed to open or only at specific times, so they had stock laying around. We gratefully accepted all that was donated and found help in 4 volunteers who were allowed to be on the road for the foundation.

Throughout 2020 the amount of donations has grown tremendously and we are happy that we're there to pick it up and distribute it to the needy.

To Provide Food Support

Emergency Food Collaboration

In May 2020 the Netherlands Red Cross contacted us to see if we were interested in a collaboration to help 3200 families in need with emergency food help for 3 months.

With funds from the Dutch ministry of BZK we collectively decided to hand out hot meals, food parcels and e-vouchers to people who registered for the program.

Together with SMDF, COME Center, K1-Brittania, Captain's Ribshack and the Netherlands Red Cross, we eventually ran this program throughout 2020 and building up to 4800 families (approx. 15.000 people).

Freegan food foundation prepared 750 foodboxes for 320 families each week. Each family of 4 got worth of \$252 per month, which included a minimum of 35% of fresh fruits and vegetables.

Each week 4 staff members and 8 volunteers worked tirelessly to pack the parcels, distribute it to 42 area volunteers where the beneficiaries could pick up the boxes. Always keeping COVID guidelines in mind.
