




In most natural disasters it is easy to see where the heroes are. The ones clearing debris, fighting fires, keeping harm at bay. Even the obvious heroes of our frontline healthcare workers are isolated from us, and often their own families, to keep us safe. But there is another type of hidden hero in this pandemic...those that are reaching, striving, and building community.

I would propose to you that the singers in this book are those such heroes. They have found creative ways to build community. While we may not understand all of their methods (ahem... TikTok, Among Us), they have creatively found ways of staying connected with each other. Online Prom. Friendsgiving over Zoom. Reintroducing family game night. They have had to adapt to a crisis that has robbed from them much of what defined our youth. Time together in community.

One of the most significant ways they have kept community is through singing. They have been a part of the transformation of a nearly 2,000 year old artform - singing in a chorus. I assure you that none of them joined choir to sing their individual part into a computer screen to be stitched together into a beautiful, but inadequate representation of choral music. But they did it anyway. They pushed aside self-interest to give back to something that means a lot to them... singing in community.

While all of our voices come from different backgrounds and perspectives, I believe we can agree and join our voices in unison to hope that these times will bring us together in community. We all wish for them a future where they take the skills they've earned through this trying time to make this world a better place. We at YCCM are honored to be a part of their path, and heartened by their efforts to work with us to present this unique season of the Youth Chorale of Central Minnesota.

Katerina holds a Master of Music in Composition from the University of British Columbia ('17) and an Honours Bachelor of Music degree in Composition and Improvisation from Wilfrid Laurier University ('15). She has studied composition under Dorothy Chang, Keith Hamel, Stephen Chatman, Linda Catlin Smith, and Glenn Buhr; and voice under Vicki St. Pierre, James Westman, and Brian McIntosh. Katerina serves on the BC Advisory Council for the Canadian Music Centre.
