

Privacy Policy

Your privacy is critically important to us. At DeepTarget we follow these fundamental principles:

- We don't ask you for personal information unless we truly need it. (We can't stand services that ask you for things like your gender or income level for no apparent reason.)
- We don't share your personal information with anyone except to comply with the law, develop our products, or protect our rights.
- We don't store personal information on our servers unless required for the on-going operation of one of our services.

DEEPTARGET Inc. (“**DEEPTARGET**”) operates its primary website DEEPTARGET.com. It is DEEPTARGET's policy to respect your privacy regarding any information we may collect while operating our websites.

Website Visitors

Like most website operators, DEEPTARGET collects non-personally-identifying information of the sort that web browsers and servers typically make available, such as the browser type, language preference, referring site, and the date and time of each visitor request.

DEEPTARGET's purpose in collecting non-personally identifying information is to better understand how DEEPTARGET's visitors use its website. From time to time, DEEPTARGET may release non-personally-identifying information in the aggregate, e.g., by publishing a report on trends in the usage of its website.

DEEPTARGET also collects potentially personally-identifying information like Internet Protocol (IP) addresses for logged in users and for users leaving comments on DeepTarget blogs. DEEPTARGET only discloses logged in user and commenter IP addresses under the same circumstances that it uses and discloses personally-identifying information as described below, except that blog commenter IP addresses are visible and disclosed to the administrators of the blog where the comment was left.

Gathering of Personally-Identifying Information

Certain visitors to DEEPTARGET's websites choose to interact with DEEPTARGET in ways that require DEEPTARGET to gather personally-identifying information. The amount and type of information that DEEPTARGET gathers depends on the nature of the interaction. For example, we ask visitors who sign up for a product such as DeepTarget OLB or DeepTarget Email to provide a username and email address. Those who engage in transactions with DEEPTARGET are asked to provide additional information, including as necessary the personal and financial information required to process those transactions. In each case, DEEPTARGET collects such

information only insofar as is necessary or appropriate to fulfill the purpose of the visitor's interaction with DEEPTARGET. DEEPTARGET does not disclose personally-identifying information other than as described below. And visitors can always refuse to supply personally-identifying information, with the caveat that it may prevent them from engaging in certain website-related activities.

Aggregated Statistics

DEEPTARGET may collect statistics about the behaviour of visitors to its websites. For instance, DEEPTARGET may monitor email usage in its product DeepTarget Email to help identify spam. DEEPTARGET may display this information publicly or provide it to others. However, DEEPTARGET does not disclose personally-identifying information other than as described below.

Protection of Certain Personally-Identifying Information

DEEPTARGET discloses potentially personally-identifying and personally-identifying information only to those of its employees, contractors and affiliated organizations that (i) need to know that information in order to process it on DEEPTARGET's behalf or to provide services available at DEEPTARGET's websites or in DEEPTARGET's Products and/or services, and (ii) that have agreed not to disclose it to others. Some of those employees, contractors and affiliated organizations may be located outside of your home country; by using DEEPTARGET's websites, you consent to the transfer of such information to them. DEEPTARGET will not rent or sell potentially personally-identifying and personally-identifying information to anyone. Other than to its employees, contractors and affiliated organizations, as described above, DEEPTARGET discloses potentially personally-identifying and personally-identifying information only in response to a subpoena, court order or other governmental request, or when DEEPTARGET believes in good faith that disclosure is reasonably necessary to protect the property or rights of DEEPTARGET, third parties or the public at large. If you are a registered user of a DEEPTARGET website and have supplied your email address, DEEPTARGET may occasionally send you an email to tell you about new features, solicit your feedback, or just keep you up to date with what's going on with DEEPTARGET and our products. We primarily use our various product blogs to communicate this type of information, so we expect to keep this type of email to a minimum. If you send us a request (for example via a support email or via one of our feedback mechanisms), we reserve the right to publish it in order to help us clarify or respond to your request or to help us support other users. DEEPTARGET takes all measures reasonably necessary to protect against the unauthorized access, use, alteration or destruction of potentially personally-identifying and personally-identifying information.

Cookies

A cookie is a string of information that a website stores on a visitor's computer, and that the visitor's browser provides to the website each time the visitor returns. DEEPTARGET uses cookies to help DEEPTARGET identify and track visitors, their usage of DEEPTARGET website or its products, and their website access preferences. DEEPTARGET visitors who do not wish to have cookies placed on their computers should set their browsers to refuse cookies before using DEEPTARGET's websites, with the drawback that certain features of DEEPTARGET's websites may not function properly without the aid of cookies.

Business Transfers

If DEEPTARGET , or substantially all of its assets, were acquired, or in the unlikely event that DEEPTARGET goes out of business or enters bankruptcy, user information would be one of the assets that is transferred or acquired by a third party. You acknowledge that such transfers may occur, and that any acquirer of DEEPTARGET may continue to use your personal information as set forth in this policy.

Ads

Ads appearing on any of our websites may be delivered to users by advertising partners, who may set cookies. These cookies allow the ad server to recognize your computer each time they send you an online advertisement to compile information about you or others who use your computer. This information allows ad networks to, among other things, deliver targeted advertisements that they believe will be of most interest to you. This Privacy Policy covers the use of cookies by DEEPTARGET and does not cover the use of cookies by any advertisers.

Comments

Comments and other content submitted to our service are not saved on our servers unless they were marked as false positives, in which case we store them long enough to use them to improve the service to avoid future false positives.
