

Our Skilled Nursing, Home Health and Hospice teams all achieved exceptional regulatory body survey results.

2022 has been our busiest year yet, and can be summarized in a few words: change, growth, and opportunity. Our fiscal year ended on a strong note both financially and operationally. Our Skilled Nursing, Home Health and Hospice teams all achieved exceptional regulatory body survey results. We brought in more religious Sisters from overseas to become a part of the St. Camillus family. We opened our beautiful East Residence a month early and have stayed ahead of our move-in schedule. The remodel of the first floor of our West Residence has provided Independent Living residents one beautiful, integrated community to call home. Our Home Health Services department received training on telehealth monitoring and launched that service to the community. The Organizational and Professional Development (OPD) department became a certified training site for CNAs. Our Environmental Services department collaborated with the OPD department to sponsor one of the first Electrician's Apprentice programs on a long-term care campus. We collaborated with Marquette University to develop and pilot our Students in Residence Program. In the spirit of supporting and growing our mission, we opened the St. Camillus Co-Op as a service to our staff.

Our momentum has not slowed down in the new fiscal year. We are in process of developing a new strategic plan that will ensure a sustained successful future, with new initiatives to continue to positively affect our culture. To paraphrase Vince Lombardi, individual commitment to the betterment of the team is what makes a team work, a company work, a society work, a civilization work. We are grateful for the talent and service of our Board of Directors, and for the dedication and passion of all the people who live, work and volunteer in our community.

HISTORY OF THE ORDER OF ST. CAMILLUS - USA DELEGATION

In September of 1919, the Superior of the German Province of The Order of St. Camillus received a letter from Rev. James Durward of the diocese of St. Paul, Minnesota. Fr. Durward offered to donate a beautiful spot named Durward's Glen near Baraboo, Wisconsin to the Order. With the offer came the condition that a hospital be built on the site. The German Province sent Father Michael Mueller to America in the Fall of 1921 to investigate the matter.

On the voyage, Fr. Mueller met the Most Rev. Sebastian Messmer, Archbishop of Milwaukee. The Archbishop invited Fr. Mueller to visit Milwaukee if the project in Durward's Glen proved to be impractical. Fr. Mueller found the Durward's Glen site to be too remote for a hospital, and he instead returned to Milwaukee with hopes of finding a location there.

On February 12, 1923, Fr. Mueller purchased a house on the south side of Milwaukee to serve as a monastery. He then purchased a second, adjacent house which he and other German Camillians opened as a small hospital for the old and incurable. The request for rooms in the small hospital became so numerous that the community decided to build a new and more modern hospital which opened in Wauwatosa in 1932. It became known as the St. Camillus campus where the ministry continues today.



MINISTRIES OF THE ORDER

The ministries of the Camillians can be subdivided into 6 major categories:

Hospitals: Camillians work in hospitals owned by the Order serving as doctors, nurses, and administrators from large metro facilities in Brazil to smaller centers in more remote regions such as the Central African Republic.

Social Health: The Camillian Order owns and operates Health Centers which focus on specific needs including services to the elderly, HIV/AIDS patients, disabled children, addiction centers, nutrition centers, and other social health services.

Education: The Order also owns multiple universities and education centers around the world which focus primarily on healthcare but include other programs as well.

Parishes: The Camillians are active in parish ministry, giving special attention to helping the poor and the sick within the parish.

Chaplaincy and Pastoral Care: Camillians serve in many public and private hospitals and communities worldwide.

Missions: The Camillians have a variety of missions throughout the world. Camillian Disaster Service International (CADIS) responds to emergency situations and aids victims of disasters world-wide.

42 countries around the world have a Camillian ministry presence.


The Order owns and operates over 91 hospitals and over 115 health centers around the world.






- The Order first came to Milwaukee in 1921, when Father Michael Mueller, a Camillian, came to the United States from Germany.
- In 1925, seven acres of land were purchased in Wauwatosa, Wisconsin.
- In 1935, the novitiate is built at Durward's Glen in Baraboo, Wisconsin.
- In 1947, the Most Reverend Charles Mansfeld, Provincial of the North American Province, is elected Superior General of the world-wide Order.

- In 1923, the first Camillian hospital opened on the south side of Milwaukee.
- The Camillians opened St. Camillus Hospital in 1932 in Wauwatosa, Wisconsin.
- On April 12th, 1946
 the Commissariate is
 elevated to the status of
 a religious province and
 is known as the North
 American Province of the
 Order of St. Camillus.





- In 1956, the St. Camillus Women's Guild was founded by Fr. Francis Anderson.
- The campus added a Community House for the priests and brothers of the Order in the 1960's that eventually transitioned into an Assisted Living Community in 1968.
- A portion of the religious Community House was converted into Camillus Court, a Memory Care Residence.
- further into senior care when the West Residence, formerly known as San Camillo Independent Living, was built in 1986 with 200 apartments.

- In the 1960's, the original hospital was added onto several times and was converted to a nursing home. The campus shifted services from acute care to subacute and serviced the long-term care market, with 70 additional beds.
- The first female patient was admitted to St. Camillus Health Center in 1969.
- In 1989, the remainder of the former Community House was converted into Camillus Court with an additional 12 rooms. Groundbreaking also took place for a new 188 bed Health Center.





- In 1991, Phase 2 of Independent Living opened with 97 additional apartments and a chapel.
- In April of 1996, the Clinical Pastoral Education Program (CPE) began at St. Camillus.
- In 2001, the Community House was leased to Kathy's House, Inc., a hospital hospitality nonprofit agency.
- In 2009, St. Camillus Home Hospice was established.

- In 1993, the Health Center converted to 69 Assisted Living apartments. The Jesuit Community began to lease the 4th floor of this building.
- In 1997, a 9-unit AIDS wing opened on the 1st floor of Court East.
- In 2004, ground was broken for 75 additional Assisted Living apartments.

- In 2016, campus houses were taken down to construct 72 new Assisted Living apartments, and the North Residence including 48 Memory Care apartments, 50 Jesuit apartments, and a new Camillian Community House.
- In 2019, construction began on the East Residence Independent Living expansion, including 168 additional apartments.
- In March 2022, the East Residence opened, completing the latest expansion on the St. Camillus campus.

- In 2011, the USA Delegation was incorporated into the Camillian Province of Brazil.
- In 2018, the North Residence, Jesuit Residence and Camillian Community House opened.
- In 2021, the Centennial Celebration of the Camillians in the USA was celebrated.

STUDENTS IN RESIDENCE

The Students in Residence Program is an intergenerational program that offers Marquette graduate students the opportunity to live at St. Camillus for reduced rent in exchange for eight hours of volunteer work on campus each week. The students have access to the Revitalize Wellness Center, all culinary venues and amenities. and have the flexibility to be innovative with how they spend their hours volunteering. St. Camillus hosted three students all whom resided in the West Residence Independent Living.

The Students in Residence Program ran from August 2022 to May 2023. Between the three students, coffee clutches, Brazilian cooking demonstrations, sports watch parties and more have been implemented into the Independent Living Life Enrichment programming. St. Camillus has grown to be much more than just a place to stay for the three Marquette students, but a home with social activities, engaging conversations and both learning and teaching opportunities.

The program is mutually beneficial to the St. Camillus residents and Marquette students. St. Camillus and Marquette University will continue the program in fall with both the number of students in residence increasing, as well as areas of campus where they will be volunteering. In 2023, students will volunteer in the Assisted Living, Memory Care and Skilled Nursing Residences in addition to Independent Living.

2022 marked the first Students in Residence Program in partnership with Marquette University.

Intergenerational relationships are known to reduce social isolation and create a sense of community.

INNOVATIVE PROGRAMMING

Innovative programming is just one of the many ways that St. Camillus strives to constantly improve the quality of life for our residents. We have Life Enrichment team members in all areas of our campus to tailor the activities and offerings to meet the specific needs of those residents.

Our Intergenerational Mobility Program (IMP) is one example of our inventive programs. It is a 12 week course focusing on physical and cognitive aspects of mobility, ambulation and strength. Created by our Research and Life Enrichment Director in Memory Care, the program pairs college students with residents who have Alzheimer's disease or a related dementia. The students, juniors from Marquette University and Wisconsin Lutheran College, majored in exercise science, physical therapy or sports medicine. As part of their "Coach" training, they received extensive instruction in gait belt use, how to "cue" residents and collect data. The students then were assigned to a resident for the duration of the program.

In each session, an individual resident's life and interests are highlighted. The skill and strength portion of the session is personalized to reflect the resident's interests with the focus being on use of the core, step height and reaction times. Resident goals include decreased falls, improved strength and balance, increased socialization and a stronger self-worth. The program concludes with a graduation ceremony where residents, along with their student Coach, walk the red carpet.

The personalized exercise portion as well as the intergenerational element of the program are two unique features of the IMP. The program will be a reoccurring offering and there are future plans to expand it for those affected by Parkinson's disease.

CNA TRAINING PROGRAM

As a benefit to employees, St. Camillus has been providing complimentary CNA training for over 10 years. In 2020, St. Camillus proactively began the process to become a host site, and was approved in September 2022.

St. Camillus incorporates ReadyCNA training, a program developed by Cinematic Health Education. ReadyCNA is a comprehensive, 40-hour, cloud-based training program to prepare individuals for careers as certified nursing assistants. Using best-in-class learning designed to engage students on their path to certification, the curriculum prepares them for the emotional demands and rewards of the CNA profession.

Additionally, the skills lab training portion offers hands-on practice with St. Camillus Independent Living residents as volunteers instead of mannequins. The clinical practice is also completed on campus in the Skilled Nursing, Assisted Living and Memory Care Residences.

The St. Camillus CNA training is completed in 90 hours in exchange for a commitment to work at St. Camillus. This program is offered to St. Camillus employees in good standing, students from partner high schools, colleges and universities, who are seeking healthcare related careers and are a minimum of 17 years of age.



APPRENTICESHIPS

Responding to the state of the current job market, St. Camillus is proactive in providing training and advancement opportunities for employees.

Our culinary apprenticeship is a 24 month program working at St. Camillus while also attending Milwaukee Area Technical College (MATC) on a part-time basis. Our culinary apprentice performs a variety of culinary duties including: rotating throughout different kitchen areas and dining venues, participating in catering and special events and becoming knowledgeable of institutional and special diets.

By providing both the on-site training as well as the educational component, the apprentice will graduate as either a cook or chef.

Our electrician apprenticeship is a 5 year commitment. The apprentice attends Waukesha County Technical College (WCTC) part-time and works along side a St. Camillus Master Electrician while on campus.

Both programs have been successful and we look forward to graduating our first apprentices.

2 apprenticeships were awarded one in electrical and one in culinary.

St. Camillus is the first Life Plan Community in Southeastern Wisconsin to offer specialty apprenticeships.



CLINICAL PASTORAL EDUCATION

The St. Camillus Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) program is a chaplaincy training program for theological students, ordained clergy, members of religious communities and qualified lay people to become skilled ministers under the training of an ACPE Certified Educator. The St. Camillus CPE program is accredited through the Association of Clinical Pastoral Education (ACPE), the premier organization that provides the highest quality CPE programs for spiritual care professionals of any faith and in any setting.

Our innovative CPE program offers three levels to students: CPE 1 and 2, and Certified Educator Training. Our students are required to complete 400 hours which includes group class instruction and a minimum of 250 hours of direct clinical ministry to our residents, staff and families. Out of this intense training program, CPE students are challenged to improve, deepen and expand the quality of their relationships and ministry.

The St. Camillus CPE Program provides our students with an environment rich in learning through opportunities to observe, interact and support our seniors, their families and staff through our full continuum of care. By examining and witnessing the physical, psychosocial and spiritual challenges of aging, the St. Camillus CPE program provides our students with a unique learning experience of human growth and dignity.


OUR SISTERS

Always looking for ways to enhance the quality of care for our residents as well as responding to the ongoing medical staffing shortage, the leadership of the USA Camillian Delegation piloted a program of hiring religious sisters to work on campus. St. Camillus provides housing and a salary in return for their employment. The Sisters come from India, Tanzania and Vietnam and their backgrounds are as varied as their homelands. Several have experience working in healthcare or caregiving, and one Sister was even a dentist in her home country. They live on-campus, either in our Trinity House or other homes, and work predominantly in our licensed areas of campus.

Besides housing and a salary, St. Camillus also provides the Sisters with education and training. Several of the Sisters have passed the Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) exams and some have become licensed Registered Nurses (RN). Two of the Sisters are now RN Supervisors on campus. Our residents are helping to teach the Sisters as well, serving as English as a Second Language instructors.

The Sisters are wonderful addition to our campus. Our residents receive quality and compassionate care and the Sisters are able to support their Orders and live out the mission of St. Camillus to "hold more heart in your hands."

St. Camillus Serves is under the "umbrella" of the Mission Office with the goal of helping to advance the mission of St. Camillus through service to our employees, our residents and families, and the community. 2022 was a year filled with projects and initiatives.

Service to employees

- Tony Brazil Food Drive honored the memory of our cherished co-worker, allowed the opening of the St. Camillus Food Co-op which offers non-perishable food at no cost to employees. In the first 4 months, the Co-op served more than 140 shoppers.
- Emergency Transportation Pilot Project was a Lyft program helping caregivers and dietary staff with emergency rides to work if their main transportation failed.
- Gifts from the Heart Toy Drive fulfilled 147 children's wish lists with more than 300 gifts distributed to employee families.

Service to residents & their families

 As part of our campus-wide volunteer program we engaged a new volunteer coordinator, expanded pet

 100 Visits Project marked Wisconsin's Reducing Social Isolation and Loneliness Awareness Week. Numerous volunteers made 105 visits with our seniors.

Service to the community

- Mother of Perpetual Help Parish in West Allis: Our campus priests support the parishioners by presiding over Mass, hearing confessions, and providing sacraments. Further, St. Camillus Serves provided senior focused educational sessions and hosted a "Celebrate Seniors" lunch at the parish.
- Hunger Taskforce: Teams assembled Senior Stock Boxes for low income seniors in Milwaukee.
- Eras Senior Network: Teams participated in fall clean up for seniors in need.
- Kathy's House: We hosted our annual Paper Drive and provided lunches and notes of encouragement to the guests staying in Kathy's House.

We are excited to continue to live our mission at St. Camillus and working together to serve even more people in the future.







LAY CAMILLIAN FAMILY

The Lay Camillian Family is just one of the many volunteer opportunities available to our residents. The origin of this international organization dates back to St. Camillus himself when he invited lay people to join his ministry of serving the aging and sick. With thousands of members throughout the world, the Lay Camillian Family is a vibrant community.

St. Camillus Lay Camillian Family members reside both on and off our campus and membership consists of both praying and active members. Monthly meetings include a program and discussion topic as well as an opportunity to discern volunteer and outreach events. Volunteer opportunities on campus include prayer chain membership, distributing communion and visiting with apartment-bound residents, assisting residents with transportation to and from masses, and washing and pressing the linens used in our three chapels. Other popular spiritual programs that benefit our residents include creating a Lenten calendar and the Advent Secret Prayer Partner program.

Outreach is a pillar of the Lay Camillian Family as well. Greeting cards are delivered monthly to our Assisted Living and Memory Care residents and the Lay Camillian Family is a regular contributor to our campus Co-op Food Pantry. The Lay Camillian Family also partnered with our Pastoral Care team and was instrumental in the addition of St. Camillus statues in our chapels.




