

- For differentiation purposes, students can choose a certain number to complete instead of all of them.


Look at the sample in your handout. Choose a few questions to adapt to your current/next reading selection.

DON'T REINVENT THE WHEEL


Go to Google or Pinterest to search for anchor chart ideas for your upcoming lesson.

Simply hand out sheets of paper that ask:


- (a) "Can you summarize what you read today?"

- (c) "What questions do you still have about what you read?"
