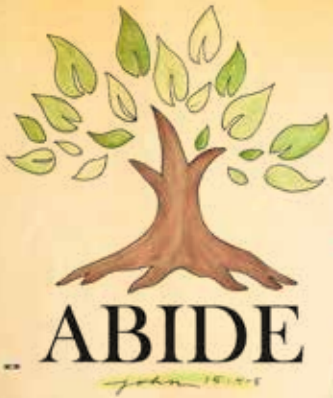

This summer has brought a tremendous amount of excitement with the construction ground-breaking ceremony in May and actual excavation beginning in June! Our Phase One expansion plans are in full swing. We will be adding 11 new classrooms, renovating and remodeling our current classrooms, and adding a new front entrance and commons space for our school. These additions will be

transformational for Park Christian School, creating places for 21st century learning.

Our strategic priorities remain the same. We are working to enhance the everyday experience at PCS. We are creating spaces and places for our students and teachers to do their best work. We are seeking sustainable funding as we move into the expansion projects and beyond. In the midst of all of that, be assured that Jesus will be pre-eminent at Park Christian School and our objectives will remain the same.

As the concrete is being poured and the steel beams are being set in place, I am reminded that unless the Lord builds the house, we labor in vain! God is so good, and I am thankful for what the new building will mean for PCS. But I am also reminded that who we are and all that we strive for will not change! Jesus will always be at the center of our school. Being a Christ-centered academic community, equipping students to think biblically, live wisely, and serve faithfully will not change.

PCS EXPANSION UPDATE

Momentum is building and dirt is flying! Since our groundbreaking, ZCON construction has been busy laying foundations and completing steel skeletons of the elementary education wing and the new commons and north entrance. Our goal is to enclose these areas by mid-November and to complete Phase One construction by fall of 2019. We caught up with ZCON Construction president (and PCS parent) Lance Ziebarth with a few questions about the project:

How has your team at ZCON been encouraged as construction has progressed?

The enthusiasm has been very encouraging! We've been getting tons of questions, curiosity about the building details, and people stepping forward to partner. Personally, I've received a lot of kind words of support, which has really blessed me. Despite a few normal construction setbacks, we are essentially on schedule, so that's a great encouragement.

What are you most excited about as we move ahead?

For me, our expansion has always been about providing the opportunity for more people to experience Christian education. I know how important Park has been to our family, and I want to share the PCS experience with as many families as we possibly can! That has always been my number one motivator.

How will the PCS families and the community be blessed by this expansion?

By providing top-notch facilities, we are giving witness to the value of Christian education and our care in stewarding this.

What is something people might not know about the expansion as a whole?

(Lance chuckles...) From the south end of our school (the current science and elementary wing) to north end (the new commons area under construction), there is a two-inch elevation drop. If you want to

know more about fixing that problem, ask Park Christian parent and superintendent/project manager Mark Jacobson.

As a Park parent and ZCON Construction President, how are you feeling about our progress so far?

Currently we are working and praying for the final phase 1 giving to come in. We are trusting God for an additional \$250,000 for the commons and elementary wing. This is a giving-driven construction project. We'd also love to press on with the upcoming gymnasium and fine arts addition, estimated at \$5.5 million, because our elementary expansion will grow our attendance and demand more space! Pray that generous donors will step forward and this momentum will continue.



PCS BOOSTER CLUB

The PCS Booster Club was founded in late 2015 with the broad mission to help maximize the potential of all student athletes and athletic programs. This is done through a variety of actions – some as simple as paying for indoor driving range time for the golf teams when spring doesn't show up, to something as elaborate and long lasting as funding the new mats in the gym. The saying goes you need to look good to feel good/play good, so we have started budgeting to replace all of our team sport uniforms every four years so no participant will ever need to wear "old stuff" for the duration of their careers. Most recently we purchased new uniforms for the volleyball team and football teams. The Boosters provide money above and beyond the money that the school earmarks for athletics. In other words, everything we do and have



done would not have happened without the support of the members of the Booster Club. As an example, the school may have not been able to let every football player on the team dress this year as we wouldn't have had enough certified helmets to outfit everyone without the Booster Club paying to re-certify and purchase several new helmets. We are always looking for any time, talent, or treasure anyone can provide our group – there are plenty of opportunities to get involved beyond the mandatory concession serving when your kids are in 8th and 11th Grade!

Park Christian School has been such a blessing in my life, not only growing up but even today. During my time at the school, I learned so much truth about the Bible and saw it applied through my teachers and friends. In school, I learned about what it meant to be a Christian. In classes, we talked a lot about being obedient when God calls. Another important truth I learned was God was faithful to us when we were faithless. This truth changed my life, and I decided I would be obedient and faithful to God. After I went on to college, I decided that I wanted my life to count so that God would be glorified by my actions.

This desire to serve God and longing to make Him known took me on some crazy adventures. God has been calling me to go to Africa since I was 10 years old, but I thought it would be once I was more qualified. But this past summer God gave me the opportunity to serve in Ghana. I served in two different capacities: as a social worker and as a teacher.

While I was interning at the Department of Social Welfare in Ghana, I worked with three main population groups: disabled, elderly and orphans. One day my coworker and I went to a cured leprosy village to distribute funds to them. This was a very special experience for me because the people that lived there were hurt by society and felt like second-class citizens, forced to live in an outcast society. I quickly realized how much emotional support these people needed. It was my responsibility to help people to the center and register them. Many of them had not received physical touch in years. In many cases I was able to pray for them and speak truth into their lives that Jesus doesn't see them as outcast. We also worked with abused and/or neglected children, those in financial crisis and those having marriage problems. The best part of it all was everything in the office revolved around how Jesus would solve problems and we would openly pray in the workplace with clients -- and this is a government-sponsored program. Come on Jesus!!!

This desire I had to make my life count and glorify God has only begun. God has amazing plans for every person in this world. and too often we get distracted by our own agenda. But if we choose to let God invade our lives, we have much better things coming then we could have planned or imagined.
