Introduced in 2010, "River of Words" enables students to use humor and haiku, free verse, figurative language, vivid vocabularies and heartfelt advocacy along with paint, pencil and digital images to demonstrate their understanding of the delicate watershed of the Lowcountry and to make their voices heard.





Illustrating Native Plant Species

FROM THE SC COAST

In this lesson students will learn about native flora from the South Carolina Coast and will create a botanical illustration in pen and ink and colored pencil using a book page or newspaper substrate.

SALTMARSH SHORELINE & SEA



Crayon Engraving Habitats

In this lesson students will learn about the various distinct habitats of the Lowcountry watershed, then will use crayons or oil pastels along with black paint to create an etched artwork that depicts scenes from the shore.

BENTHIC ZONE

Block Printing



In this lesson, students will learn about bottom dwelling marine invertebrates such as Mollusks and Aquatic Arthropods then will create a series of prints using a foam plate and washable markers.

NATIVE FISH & FOODCHAINS WITH



Line & Pattern

In this lesson students will learn about the food chains in our unique ecosystem, then will use the Zentangle method to depict fanciful fauna from the Lowcountry watershed.

EXPLORING SHOREBIRDS & SEABIRDS THROUGH



Creative Collages

In this lesson students will learn about the vital role SC plays in the lives of coastal bird species, then will use texture rubbings, magazines, newspaper, and other textured papers to create a collage of an avian inhabitant from our watershed.
