



COVID-19 SAFETY STANDARDS FOR PUBLIC

The purpose of these standards to ensure the safety of all who use the Roselle Park District facilities and to help prevent the spread of a highly contagious virus. These standards are based on recommendations from the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and OSHA.

What can you do?

Preventive Measures for the Public:

- Self-monitor for signs and symptoms of the virus.
- Stay home if you are sick.
- Cover coughs and sneezes.
- Dispose of used tissues in a plastic bag lined trash receptacle.
- Frequent and thorough hand washing.
- Use provided hand sanitizer before registering.
- Wear required face coverings.
- Practice social distancing and adhere to any District guidelines.
- Do not shake hands with others.
- Use provided wipes to clean used fitness equipment.
- Bring your own pen or pre-filled registration paperwork when possible.

Health Self-Assessment

During an infectious disease outbreak, it is critical that while ill and/or experiencing the symptoms of the virus, you do not visit the Roselle Park District facilities. Therefore, patrons shall self-assess for symptoms of the virus prior to visiting.

As a general guideline, someone experiencing a fever or symptoms of the virus should not visit the public facility until:

- They have been fever-free for at least three (3) days without taking medication to reduce fever during that time; AND
- Any respiratory symptoms have improved for at least three (3) days; AND
- At least seven (7) days have passed since the symptoms began.

Reusable Face Coverings

Patrons will be required to wear a face covering while using any of the District's facilities. A face covering is intended to prevent the person wearing it from unknowingly transmitting the virus to others. A reusable face covering is a cloth, bandana, or other type of material that covers an employee's mouth and nose and meets the following criteria set forth by the CDC:

- Fit snugly but comfortably against the side of the face
- Be secured with ties or ear loops
- Include multiple layers of fabric
- Allow for breathing without restriction
- Be able to be laundered and machine-dried without damage or change to shape

What is the Roselle Park District doing?

Preventive Measures for the District:

- Educate patrons and employees on the symptoms of the virus, how it spreads, and preventive measures to take.
- Provide hand sanitizer, tissues, and trash receptacles.
- Provide face coverings and gloves to employees.
- Set up screening station at the entrance of the facility to monitor patron access.
- Ask patron to leave the facility if they are exhibiting symptoms.
- Establish staggered and limited patron access to the facility.
- Maintain regular housekeeping practices, including disinfecting surfaces.
- Disable use of publicly used drinking fountains.
- Only allow for credit card transactions to limit interaction.

Social Distancing

The District will consider and institute controls to reduce social contact and limit exposure, such as:

- Staggered and limited patron access to the facility
- Installing physical barriers (i.e., clear plastic sneeze guard at registration desk)
- Physical spacing indicators (i.e., 6 ft. floor markers)

Facility Maintenance

- Regular housekeeping practices shall be maintained, including routine cleaning and disinfecting surfaces and equipment. Appropriate cleaning products with EPA-approved emerging viral pathogens claims shall be used in disinfecting the surfaces. Employees shall be trained how to safely use the products (i.e, PPE, dilution of the product, precautions, hazards, hazard response). The District may contract outside cleaning services as needed.
