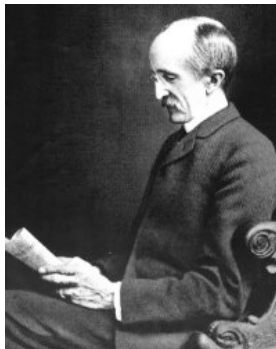

Course Overview: History and Purpose

The New York State Thoracic Society (NYSTS) is the direct descendent of the Trudeau Society, the distinguished ancestor of the current American Thoracic Society. In this tradition, the annual NYSTS meeting is the primary forum for New York State Pulmonary and Critical Care physicians and healthcare providers to share expertise in disorders of the lung, critical care illness and sleep disorders. As in previous years, a few selected topics have been identified to be discussed and examined at this annual meeting so as to improve the knowledge base, patient care competence and procedural skills of the participating practitioners.

Target Audience

Our target audience will be Pulmonologists, Critical Care Physicians / Intensivists, Sleep physicians, Pulmonary and Critical Care fellows in training, resident physicians with an interest in Pulmonary and Critical Care medicine, Pulmonary or Critical Care nurse practitioners, physician assistants and respiratory therapists.

Educational Objectives

1. The event begins with a Lung Cancer mini-symposium during which the audience will learn about CT-pathologic correlates of sub-solid lung nodules and peripheral adenocarcinomas with an update on their classification and staging, as well as molecular markers and novel targeted therapies.
2. Procedural and hands-on learning will focus on the various airway issues which arise in the critically ill patient, as well as the artificial airway devices which can be used. The audience will also learn about the basics of pleural ultrasound and its implementation in practice.
3. The audience will also learn about the early and long-term treatments which are available for pulmonary arterial hypertension, the biology of cystic fibrosis and treatment options and the evidence and techniques of cardio-cerebral resuscitation, a novel approach to out-of-hospital witnessed arrest.
4. Non-educational activities reinforce learning and support professional growth of fellows and practicing physicians. These include fellow presentations of unusual clinical cases with expert Radiology and Pathology discussion. In addition, fellows will have a forum to present their research in abstract poster format. While these sessions have not been certified for CME credit, we consider them added resources that are helpful to the education of the attendees.

Course Design

This course is comprised of lectures, interactive audience participation encouraging the intellectual exchange of ideas between faculty and participants. Poster sessions are also included as part of the educational session.

Evaluation & Outcomes Measurement

A course evaluation form will provide attendees with the opportunity to review the sessions and the speakers and to identify future educational needs. An outcomes measurement survey will be distributed to participants six months after the course.
