

This approximately \$40 million multiphased project includes the expansion of the 6th Floor Neonatal Critical Care Center, as well as work on the 7th Floor Heart & Vascular bed tower conversion.

Live Oak Bank Building Four

This 100% mass timber build—the fourth employee building on Live Oak Bank's serene campus—will be the first of its kind in the region, a signal of the economic growth and innovation happening in Wilmington.



Columbus County Schools' Tabor City K-8 Elementary School

Set to complete in 2023, we topped off this brand new energy-efficient elementary school; a project with construction assisted by a \$28 million investment by the USDA North Carolina Rural Development.



Coastal Carolina Regional Airport (EWN) Expansion

This \$25 million Design-Bid-Build project consists of a 10,020 sf terminal expansion, plus the renovation of the existing 20,650 sf one-story terminal building, bringing this pre-9/11 design into the modern era. Wilmington.



Durham Public Schools' Lyons Farm Elementary School

This 50 acres of former farmland in South Durham—named after longtime land owners, the Lyons family—is now home to a state-of-the-art elementary school, serving students in Pre-K through 5th grade. work on the 7th Floor Heart & Vascular bed tower conversion.




Common Desk Wilmington

Monteith Construction completed the restoration of the 20,000 sf historic "Gaylord Building" at 226 N. Front Street in downtown Wilmington, North Carolina—a structure built in 1908 to house Gaylord's Department Store, then the Belk-Williams Department Store in 1915, Wilmington's first Belk. Chapel Hill, NC-based East West Partners developed this project uniquely for Common Desk Wilmington, establishing downtown's first modern coworking space.

At project start, the original, abandoned building condition was structurally unsound, so much so that no one could safely go above the ground floor. As a result of this "unknown" status, Monteith Construction took a two-phased approach to pricing and planning to best control the project budget, schedule, and scope: first by tackling the shell, then the interior upfit. The project was an engineering feat, beginning with the steel skeleton installed to hold up the perimeter brick walls which were at risk of collapsing. Monteith Construction then selectively demolished and rebuilt level by level.

From design start through construction closeout, the project team aimed to strike a balance between honoring the history of 226 N Front Street and celebrating the vibrant and entrepreneurial spirit of Wilmington today. As such, preservation was a priority. The original cast iron columns, brick, and floor joists were salvaged and reused, adding vintage throughout the space. The result is a revitalized structure and community gathering place humming with activity on downtown's main pedestrian-friendly street.





John Chavis Memorial Park

Monteith Construction renovated John Chavis Memorial Park from 2019-2021, breathing fresh life into one of the community's most valued gathering spaces. The revitalized public space includes a brand-new community center—featuring a gymnasium, fitness room, locker rooms, youth lounge, and custom painted glass installation by decorated artist David Wilson—a playground, and an interactive water feature, as well as a renovated historic Carousel House-turned-meeting and amenity structure.

Based on historical records, "the 29-acre park started in 1937 as a recreation center for Black people in the area during segregation. According to the City of Raleigh, community members have been working on this upgrade since 1971. Eventually, funding came in 2014 with an updated plan." With the park renovation a long time in the making, Monteith Construction was honored to tackle the project, and identified several unique aspects early on, including community sensitivity, the unique curvature and materiality used in the 41,600 sf Community Center design, as well as the inconsistent landscape elevation—which includes both hard and soft scape, a playground, and splash pad features.

Kristen Shea, CPRP, recreational superintendent for the City of Raleigh's Parks, Recreation and Cultural Resources Department said the team at Monteith Construction "played a critical role at listening to our needs, blending our organizations, and following through on work plans. The result is a truly unique venue that the citizens and staff are enjoying daily!"







Lunshof Cup Award

Congratulations to Mike Travaglia, recipient of the 2022 Lunshof Cup, an annual award recognizing our "superintendent of the year" and named after Monteith Construction's first superintendent, Al Lunshof, an industry veteran and company legend who displayed each of our core values (and more) on his hard hat and sleeves. This year, we received a record number of nominations for the Lunshof Cup award, a reflection of our "We Before Me" culture and the respect our team members have for one another.

Over the past four years, Mike Travaglia has all but lived at Wilmington International Airport (ILM), leading the \$68M terminal expansion project which will increase the facility's space by 75% and allow the airport to serve 50% more passengers when complete in 2023. His technical skill, innate foresight, and sheer dedication to the project has made this extremely complex build run as smooth as one could hope—especially since Mike and the project team have weathered three hurricanes, a global pandemic, and international supply chain shortages. He has been a proud ambassador of Monteith Construction, acting as the main point of contact for both ILM employees and airlines operations teams, as well as paying extreme caution to Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and public safety regulations. Ask Mike about an airline route, a flight number, or a gate assignment, and we bet you he'll know the answer.





Mike has shown himself to be an exemplary team leader, managing a complex multi-year expansion and renovation project that never closed to the public. His skill, dedication, foresight, and integrity has been essential to a project that required special attention to public safety, weathered three hurricanes, a pandemic, and international supply shortages while staying on schedule and within budget. However, Mike has always gone the extra mile to accommodate the Owner's requests- from accommodating tenant personalities to assisting with lobster bakes, a perfect representation of Monteith's commitment to building relationships.



Chowan Chapel at Chowan University

The first on-campus worship center at this private Baptist university with a design that celebrates natural light and draws in the campus surroundings, creating an intimate, yet energized space for all to gather.

COVEY Restaurant

Opening summer 2023, this upscale restaurant in Midtown Wilmington will feature a main dining room, a bar grill dining room, a wine bar, tasting rooms, and a wine cellar, in addition to a state-of-the-art kitchen.




Sustainable Construction

Our goal is to be a leader in sustainable construction. Currently, we are in a discovery and diagnostic phase to best understand in what areas and how Monteith Construction can reduce our negative environmental impact while advocating and implementing sustainable best practices.

Following results of this report, and over the next few years, we will continue to work with a select group of experts to define the "what" and "why" behind our sustainability goal, as well as the actions and solutions to get us there. We will not do this alone, but in lockstep and in close collaboration with our partners—owners, architects, engineers, and trades—who each have a hand in creating a healthy built environment.





The first step of this process has been working with a third-party consultant to qualify and quantify our company's carbon emissions within three areas:

1 Emissions from Monteith Construction assets

Regional offices and the contents therewithin, company vehicles, job site trailers and equipment. Indirect emissions for utilities we purchase

Such as power that supplies our regional offices, job site trailers and equipment.

Indirect emissions that are byproducts of our construction projects

Both embodied carbon (building and infrastructure materials and construction) and operational carbon.

Impact is the sum of many parts, and the real estate industry is perhaps one of the best examples of that. Monteith Construction and each of our partnersdevelopers and owners, architects, engineers, trade partners, craftsmen—have a hand in shaping the fabric of the communities and cultures in which we live and work

Our team members are guided by strong values and a work ethic of doing things the right way. We like to think this internally driven ethos manifests into being both exceptional builders and good community stewards. Beyond buildings, we're proud of the work being done through Camp Schreiber Foundation, volunteerism, and social activism projects such as Initiative 1897.
