Applicants will be considered by a selection panel from the New Zealand School of Education. The decision of the selection panel is final.

Te Tūrama Healthcare - Mahi hauora Scholarship

Healthcare and those that work in the healthcare sector are essential and play an incredibly supportive role throughout our lives. Without those that can care for us, our elderly and our unwell our society would be far less caring and, very likely, much less safe. This NZSE Scholarship is for those that are tuned to helping others and want to take their place in New Zealand's healthcare sector and beyond.

Amount and type of award:

- The number of new scholarships to be awarded is determined annually
- Scholarships will be offered on a contestable basis to applicants who demonstrate a passion and talent for Healthcare
- The award consists of the tuition fees (value up to NZ\$9,000.00, valid until the end of 2020) for a Diploma Level 7.

Eligibility criteria:

- Be a New Zealand Citizen or a Permanent Resident for at least 3 years
- The scholarship is awarded on the basis to applicants who demonstrate a passion and talent for Healthcare
- Clear career goals related to the programme of study.

Conditions of award:

- The award will go directly into the applicant's tuition fees
- The scholarship may not be held in conjunction with any other fees scholarships
- If the recipient withdraws from study during the tenure of their scholarship they may be expected to repay the full value of the scholarship.

- An interview and a short statement of intent on why the learner wishes to pursue a Healthcare qualification

Course Descriptors

Primary Health Care (15 credits)

- You will explore the effects of socio-political and cultural determinants of health, competently applying this relevant knowledge to assist in the enhancement of health of individuals, whanau/family, organisations and communities.

Rehabilitation (15 Credits)

- Develop the skills required for worker's compensation injury management and return to work programmes in a variety of industries. You'll will learn how to plan, design, implement and evaluate injury management systems and worker's compensation processes that consider cultural perspectives and determinants of health.

Professional Practice and Legislation (15 Credits)

- Investigate the roles, functions and legislation related to health services and the role and scope of practice of the health professional in those services. They will gain an orientation to the breadth of possible employment.

Research for Health Care Practice (15 Credits)

- Gain knowledge and skills of purposeful reading, critique and use of research for professional health care in practice.

Geriatric Care (15 Credits)

- This course will explore the holistic health of the older adult from a psychological, socio-economic, spiritual, political and cultural view. You will explore the concept of positive aging, life expectancy and quality of life.

Palliative Care (15 Credits)

- Investigate the concepts of quality of life and quality of dying, reflecting on legal, ethical, cultural, religious and a personal viewpoint. You will critically examine the holistic complexities of a life threatening illness on the individual, whanau/family, community and the health professional's role and responsibilities in response.

Work Placement (30 Credits)

- Work as a practitioner and advocate with individuals, whanau/families and organisations to develop health management plans that build on the strengths and enhance the resilience of individuals, whanau/families and communities.
