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Dear Parents, Caregivers and Friends of the School,  
Tena Koutou Katoa Nga mihi nui Ki a Koutou Katoa,

Last week's inaugural exchange with Takapuna Normal Intermediate was a raging success with all our athletes enjoying the opportunity to play competitive sport for their school. With our students being cheered on by their family and peers, we managed to win the exchange 10 points to 12. My thanks to Alice Browning and a large number of our teaching staff for preparing and coaching our teams on the day.

Continuing with a sporting theme, congratulations to Miss Loader and Room 19 who took out the first Staff v Students sporting clash of the year on Wednesday. Non-Stop Cricket was the game and Room 19 scored 46 runs with the teachers losing by 1. The staff are looking forward to the Football match that will take place next term.

There is a teacher only day scheduled for Friday 21 August. This replaces the planned TOD that was due to take place on 5 June. Our staff will be working with renowned Maths expert Lucie Cheeseman as we look to strengthen our approach to teaching mathematics across the school. Authority for such days is derived from the accord between the teacher unions and the Ministry of Education.

On Tuesday and Wednesday this week, we hosted the bi-annual Science Roadshow, which as always, was a great success. It aims to showcase different areas of science; this year focused on geology and physics, to engage our learners in practical large-scale, hands-on experiments that they may not otherwise experience in a school environment. The Roadshow team present their show in a fun, engaging way that intends to further inspire some of our learners along a science career path.

You will receive your child's mid-year conference report on Friday 31 July. Post lockdown we wanted to focus on our core business of teaching and learning and not rush the reporting process. As a result the report will differ slightly from previous years, whilst continuing to focus on the progress and achievement of your child in reading, writing and mathematics. There is also a continued focus on Goal Setting. The report will include a general comment on your child's ability to display our core values and core competencies. Due to Covid-19 and the disruption to our students' education, our intent is to celebrate each child's achievements this year, while also focusing their attention on setting achievable goals for Terms 3 and 4. This document has been a collaboration between teacher and student, therefore, we encourage you to bring your child to the conference in Week 3, where the report will be discussed further. You will also receive a specialist report via email. This report will provide information about the specialist programmes that your child has completed so far in 2020. Grades will only appear for the specialist areas that your child has completed. The other specialist subjects will be graded on your child's end of year report.

Conferences will be held on Wednesday 5 August (1:45pm to 7.30 pm) and Thursday 6 August (3:45 pm to 7:15pm). The student conferences will be 14 minutes long with a one minute change over time. To book your appointment, click on School Interviews and use parent access code: **v9bmw**. Please note: School will close early at 1:00pm on Wednesday 5 August. If you require your child to stay at school until 3pm, supervision in the library will be provided. ### 2020 ICAS Assessments



UNSW Global

We will be participating in the world-renowned ICAS Assessments again this year. ICAS is developed by UNSW Global, a wholly owned subsidiary of the University of New South Wales, with over 35 years' experience in educational assessments.

ICAS is designed to target students' higher-order thinking and problem-solving skills in English, Mathematics, Science, Writing, Spelling and Digital Technologies.

Each assessment celebrates students' accomplishments by providing opportunities for recognition. Every student will receive a certificate and an online result report. Top performers will be eligible for medals and are invited to attend special award ceremonies to have their academic excellence publicly recognised.

The assessments are suitable for students wishing to extend themselves academically and take up the personal challenge of competing in an international assessment. Your child will be presented with high-quality, expert-developed questions, allowing them to apply their learning without the need for prior study or revision.

ICAS Assessments are now online, a move that reflects a sector-wide transition to computer-based assessment. This allows greater accessibility for students and faster delivery of results. The sitting dates are as follows, but this does not include writing, which unfortunately is not being conducted this year:

Entry to these assessments is through the online shop. PLEASE NOTE: All entries and payments must be made by 9am Friday 31 July. Any entries received after this date cannot be accepted. —


We may be young, or little in age
