Dear Parents, Caregivers and Friends of the School, Tena Koutou Katoa Nga mihi nui Ki a Koutou Katoa,

I am looking forward to the school speech finals next week. The quality of speeches always impresses me and I have no doubt that this will continue this year. Our own daughters have been immersed in writing their respective speeches and have been practicing in front of the mirror, their parents and grandparents over the last week. Like me, many of you will probably know your child's speech inside out by the time they present it in class. Please feel free to join us next Thursday afternoon in hall for our School Speech Finals from 1:50pm. I can guarantee you will be entertained.

For the last two weeks, we have investigated inappropriate comments, reels and images posted to TikTok by some of our students on alias accounts that use our name and logo. The degrading and inappropriate images and comments were explicitly directed at members of our teaching staff. This has had a detrimental effect on many of my colleagues, and I am sure you will agree that there is no place for this within our community. Several students and their families were spoken to along with the entire student body on Monday morning. Could I respectfully request that you speak with your children about the appropriate use of social media and that actions can have consequences? We have successfully closed many alias accounts and have requested that the remaining images and comments be taken down. Students should unfollow accounts like these to avoid being linked to this behaviour. If you would like to see whether your child has participated in an alias account, open their TikTok app, click profile, then settings and scroll down to switch accounts where it will list all accounts your child owns or associates with. We continue to punch above our weight on the sports field and have had more success. Our Year 7 futsal team won their zone day last week and will progress to the Auckland finals. This is on the back of some pleasing cross country results, netball victories and impressive results in girls' football. My continued thanks to the coaches and managers who give up their time for our students.

I enjoyed taking our Pacific Islands students to TGS yesterday where they connected with teachers and students leaders. After a hearty breakfast our students began planning activities for Tongan Language week that will take place in Week 7. One activity will involve cooking some traditional Tongan food and sharing this with our TGS students and staff.

Our learners continue to be engaged in the classroom and are looking forward to their respective inquiries this term. Below are some excerpts describing what each team will focus on this term.

Team Rangitoto will explore the question, "What should we improve, remake or destroy?". We will be focusing on how things change over time, with a particular focus on housing. The students will have opportunities to plan and design a house focusing on sustainability and cost efficiency.

Students of Motuihe will be exploring and making personal connections to the statement, Technology through the decades. Tamariki will choose a decade that interests them and draw a house floor plan inspired by houses in that decade. Motuihe students will create a diorama or 3D model of a room (e.g. bedroom, lounge, etc.) within their house. Their rooms will reflect trends of their decade, including technology. Students' understanding will be further enhanced by comparing and contrasting the technology from each decade.

Team Motutapu's focus question is "What is our connection to Papatūānuku?" As a team, we are focusing on ocean sustainability and the global plastic crisis. We aim to use the technology design process to plan and construct a feature at school that will benefit our community, using recycled plastic.

This term team Rakino, as part of a technology focus in integrated studies, will consider the question of "What forms of technology might we improve, remake or destroy to better our lives?". Using a framework of "understand, know and do" we will answer the question of what is technology and how has it enhanced our lives. We then look to the future and investigate how we might enhance our lives even further through adaptations and technological innovations.

I would like to take the opportunity to farewell Miss Lee-Ann Bosch who is leaving us to be closer to home in Pukekohe. Lee-Ann will be missed by the staff and students alike and we wish her all the best for the next step of her career and life in New Zealand. We welcome Mrs Deborah Yeo to Belmont Intermediate School and look forward to supporting her as she starts her time with us on Monday.

Lastly, congratulations to those who received Principal's Certificates this week; Leighton Jones, Petra Wehrle, Sam Schneebeli, Lily Maurice, Violet Goodwin, Ruben Newton, Hinata Sato, Ruby Milne, Katya Naserallah and Emily Western.
