## Reminder of Covid Procedures

If your child tests positive for Covid, please ensure the school gets notified as soon as possible by emailing the office [office@belmontint.school.nz](mailto:office@belmontint.school.nz)

A reminder that Day 0 is the date symptoms first appeared or the date of the positive test - whichever is earlier. Students can return to school on their Day 8 after completing 7 days of isolation providing they are symptom-free. If your child is a Household Contact they do not need to isolate. They should complete a RAT each day for five days and continue to attend school as long as the test is negative and they do not have any COVID-19 symptoms. To keep our staff and students safe, we ask that these procedures are followed by all.



## Kids' Lit Quiz National Champs!

This year after winning the Auckland heats, Belmont Intermediate went to Wellington to compete at the national Kids' Lit Quiz competition. This was held at the National Library of New Zealand involving 16 teams competing for the title of national champion. The national event was very different from the Auckland competition, as you had to press a buzzer extremely quickly and say the answer into the microphone as opposed to writing the answer down. Each answer was worth two points, but one point was lost if the answer was incorrect—adding another level of pressure. There were 5 categories each with 15 questions. The topics were: Authors, Demi-Gods, NZ Picture Books, Titles, and Antagonists. The Belmont team: Thomas Bennett, Felix Gould, Zara Matthews, Elizabeth Ellis, (with Maddie Wylie attending as a reserve), won with an awesome score of 28, which was 6 points clear of the other teams. Belmont Intermediate has now achieved more National Final first places than any other team in NZ, placing first in 2022, 2018, 2010 and 2009.
