### Reaching more young people

Last year we reported how we had adapted our way of working due to the pandemic restrictions preventing us from running residentials.

Our change of focus allowed us to reach more young people in the local area, working with Oban High School, North Argyll Carers Centre and Oban Youth Cafe. We are over the moon to report now that this method has allowed us to work with over 500 young people during the last year - which is a record amount. We are so grateful to our funders and supporters who have made this possible.



### Working with schools

Our work with Oban High School has been going from strength to strength. Pupils have been benefitting from multi-day activity sessions including winter hill walking, coasteering and climbing.

Welcome to Fiona, Finance and Admin Lead Fiona joins us with over 25 years finance and admin experience.


