Residentials are back!

At last we are so happy to report that our residential programme has resumed. After a challenging few years learning how to adapt our way of working in line with the pandemic restrictions, our staff and young people had a brilliant year getting back to the benefits of our residential activity courses. This year we ran 13 residentials with young people from the local area and from as far away as Cornwall.





Winter residential programme



Following a successful bid to the Argyll and Bute Community Led Local Development (CLLD) Fund we were able to run a winter programme of residentials for 63 local young people from Oban High School, St Columba's Primary School and Oban Youth Cafe. Staff and young people braved the rain, wind and snow to take part in winter activities.

Key stats

During this year we have:

- Delivered 13 residentials
- Worked with 292 young people from all over the country
- Delivered 129 days of activities

Summer sensations

Every August we deliver coasteering sessions in partnership with Oban Atlantis leisure centre; this is part of Summer Sensations; an annual programme run by Oban Atlantis for P6/7 pupils (ages 11-13) making the transition to Oban High School. Our sessions were a great success with 48 young people attending - it gives pupils a chance to have some fun while getting to know their potential classmates and taking part in physical exercise.

Headteacher Peter Bain said: "The group experienced some challenging activities and spoke about how they had each developed their resilience, team-building and leadership skills to a significant degree, as well as having a lot of fun."
