





VISITOR REQUIREMENTS

To prevent COVID-19 and to protect the health and safety of our residents and staff, we will require you to adhere to these safety measures when visiting our community.

Mandatory Masking




at entry. No cloth or homemade mask allowed.

You'll be temperaturescreened and questioned about health status, COVID symptoms and exposure.

SCHEDULED VISITATION ACCESS*

*Unless prohibited by local health department.

Visitation will be determined by the presence of COVID-19 on campus and the county positivity rate for COVID-19 testing. Outdoor visitation is preferred, weather permitting and resident appropriate. During periods of Medium risk, indoor visitors will be required to provide proof of a negative COVID-19 test within 2-3 days prior to visiting the community.

All visits must be scheduled in advance with no more than 2 visitors per resident at one time.

Outdoor visits preferred – weather permitting.

Visitation will be suspended:

- If a resident or employee tests positive for COVID-19, no matter the county positivity rate.
- If the campus has a positive, it must go 14 days without a new positive in order to re-start indoor visitation.

HIGH RISK ▲ ▲ ▲

- >10% county positivity rate
- \bullet No COVID on campus
- · Outdoor visits allowed
- Indoor visits limited to compassionate care.

MEDIUM RISK A

- 5-10% county positivity rate
- No COVID on campus
- Outdoor visit allowed
- Indoor visits allowed with negative COVID-19 test

LOW RISK

<5% county positivity rate

- · No COVID on campus
- Outdoor visits allowed
- · Indoor visits allowed



KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

As we begin to reopen, we are keeping several of our COVID-19 policies in place for the continued health and safety of our residents and employees.

Please call in advance to schedule your visit. The campus may limit number of visitors and set time parameters.

NO VISITATION WHEN:

- /\ You have a fever.
- 1 You have any symptoms of COVID-19.
- You haven't had a negative COVID-19 test within the past 2-3 days. (For indoor visitation during Medium Risk levels)
- You have been exposed to an infected person in the past 14 days.
- You're unable to practice proper infection control.

SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19

Who is at risk?

- Anyone can have mild to severe symptoms.
- Older adults
 and people who
 have severe underlying
 medical conditions like
 heart or lung disease
 or diabetes seem to
 be at higher risk for
 developing more
 serious complications
 from COVID-19 illness.

Watch for symptoms

People with COVID-19 have had a wide range of symptoms reported – ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness.

Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. People with these symptoms may have COVID-19:

- · Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- · Muscle or body aches
- Headache

- New loss of taste or smell
- · Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea
