

The Play

Shakespeare writes, "All the world's a stage. And the men and women merely players; they have their exits and their entrances; and one man in his time plays many parts..."

("As You Like It," Jaques, 1599). So it is.

Much like the film, "The Truman Story," where Jim Carrey, playing the part of everyman and living in ignorant bliss under a false dome, is oblivious to his role in an on-going TV drama. So, each of us are playing out our parts, in like manner, believing that the stage and the play is all there is.

Well, Jesus pointed us to the greater truth: "...I go to prepare a place for you...that where I am there you may be also" (John 14.2,3). So, there's something more? Yes, beyond this earthly stage, there's a heavenly reality that awaits us. For..."eye has not seen and ear has not heard...all that God has prepared for those who love Him" (1 Cor.2.9).


