I felt I was indecisive on what I wanted to do. I entered the VCAL program and undertook a VET course at Kangan doing Applied Fashion. The skill set I gained from the course was extensive including the amount of planning it takes to make one garment, the materials that are needed, the availability of fabrics, testing the durability of the fit, and the detailed portfolio that I needed to create for assessment. It was quite extensive.

However, after I completed my year 12, I did not pursue a career in the fashion industry. Instead, I chose to study a Diploma of Theatre Arts at Melbourne Polytechnic Prahran.

The studies involved the history of theatre, the techniques, the marketing aspects, backstage organisation, and the on-stage presence.

The collaboration with other groups including live production, costume and makeup, was very exciting and informative.

After completing my theatre arts in 2017, the years from 2018 to end of 2022, were difficult as I struggled to secure employment. It was a challenging time, especially during the COVID pandemic in 2020 and 2021.

I am working as a duty manager at Vinnies Reservoir, and I am absolutely loving it! I am mainly responsible for the day-to-day operations, managing the volunteers, and customer relations.
