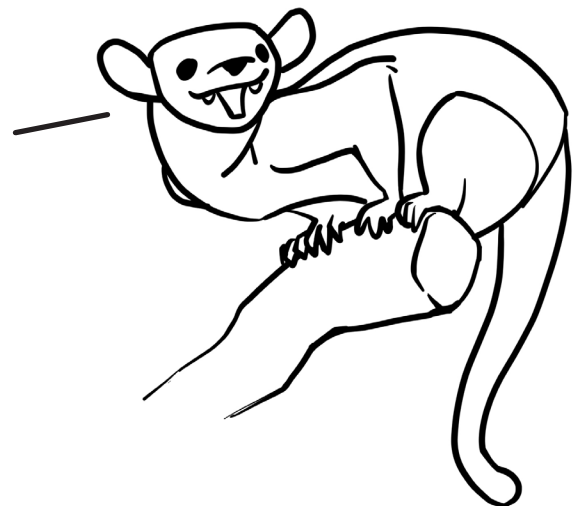
We're excited to teach you this week all about another tree loving mammal, the tallest in the world, the giraffe!

Hidden Objects & Coloring

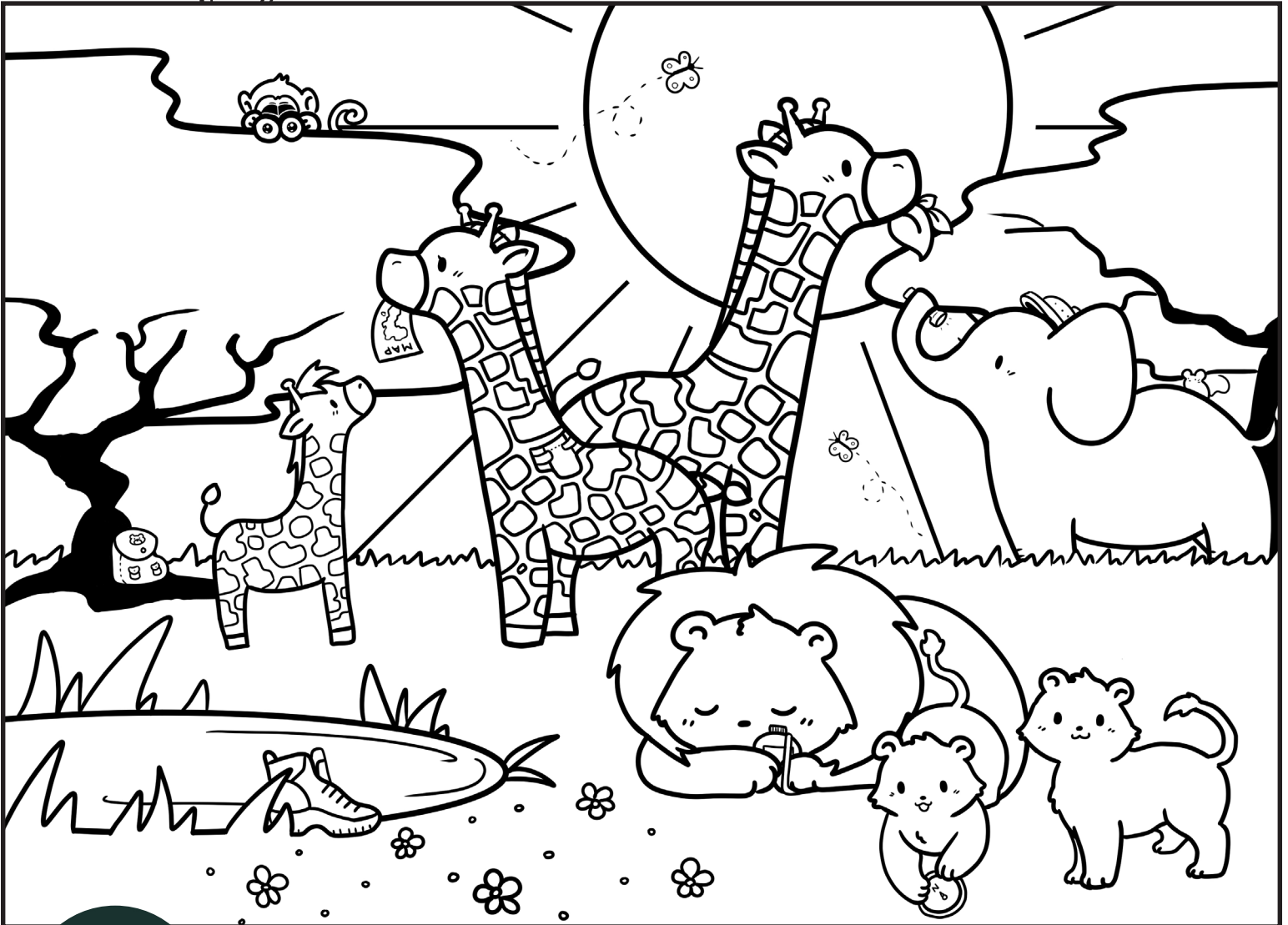

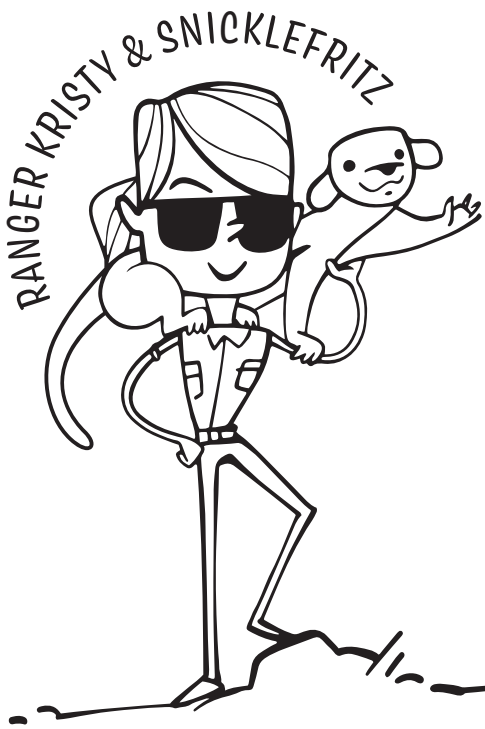
Uh oh! It looks like the animals scattered some of our gear. Can you help me find the missing items?

Giraffe Fact Crossword Puzzle

Gather 'round, campers. It's time for more giraffe facts!

We know that giraffes are the tallest mammal species in the world and can grow up to 20 feet tall! They live in Africa, and they grow tall so they can eat leaves from the very tops of trees. A giraffe's tongue is dark and purple to protect them from getting sunburned, and its thickness protects them from thorns. There are four types of giraffes and each of them has different spots.

No two giraffes are found to have the same spot pattern - just like our fingerprints! Did you also know that giraffes can run up to 35 miles per hour? That's fast! Giraffes in the wild can live up to 20-25 years. Giraffes average about 30 minutes of sleep per day! Giraffes only drink water every few days. They are rarely lying down because they need to protect themselves from predators. A baby giraffe is called a calf. A group of giraffes is called a tower or a herd.
