

2021 COVID Response Timeline Present – January 1, 2021

September 9, 2021 – President Joe Biden announces that all medical facilities that receive Medicare and Medicaid funds will be subject to a vaccine mandate or risk losing funding. Also, Biden asked the Department of Labor to require vaccination or weekly testing in all businesses with 100 or more employees.

September 3, 2021 – Aberdeen Heights announces three residents (two independent living and one assisted living), one essential health care worker and one non-direct resident care employee have tested positive for the virus. The residents will recuperate in their apartments or a designated COVID-19 isolation area, cared for by designated staff. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue.

September 3, 2021 – Rolla Presbyterian Manor announces a contract employee has tested positive for the virus. The employee last worked August 27. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue.

September 3, 2021 – Newton Presbyterian Manor announces two non-direct care employees have tested positive for the virus. The employees last worked on August 27 and September 1, respectively. The health department has been notified and visitation remains suspended per their order. Surveillance testing will continue.

September 3, 2021 – PMMA launches formal "Why Vax?" campaign encouraging employees who have not yet gotten vaccinated to consider vaccination.

August 27, 2021 – Topeka Presbyterian Manor announces a health care employee has tested positive for the virus. The employee last worked on August 21. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue.

August 27, 2021 – Aberdeen Village announces four independent living residents have tested positive for COVID-19. The residents will recover in their residences. The health department has been notified. Indoor visitation and communal dining are paused for independent living at this time.

August 27, 2021 – Manor of the Plains announces an essential health care worker has tested positive for the virus. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue.

August 21, 2021 – Parsons Presbyterian Manor announces an essential health care worker has tested positive for the virus. The employee last worked on August 9. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue.

August 21, 2021 – Salina Presbyterian Manor announces an employee has tested positive for the virus. The employee has not worked since August 5. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue.

August 20, 2021 – Farmington Presbyterian Manor announces two non-direct care employees have tested positive for the virus. The health department has been notified. Surveillance testing will continue. Visitation and communal dining activities are paused.

August 20, 2021 – Emporia Presbyterian Manor announces a contract health care employee has tested positive for the virus. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue.

August 20, 2021 – Topeka Presbyterian Manor announces a contract health care employee and a direct resident care employee have tested positive for the virus. The employees last worked on August 15 and 17 respectively. The health department has been notified. Visitation, communal dining and activities are suspended at this time. Surveillance testing will continue.

August 20, 2021 – Fort Scott Presbyterian Village announces an assisted living resident has tested positive for the virus. The resident will recover in their apartment. Indoor visitation remains suspended. Surveillance testing will continue. The health department has been notified.

August 20, 2021 – Aberdeen Village announces three independent living residents and an essential health care employee have tested positive for the virus. The residents will recuperate in the COVID-19 isolation area, cared for by designated staff. The employee last worked on August 18. The health department has been notified and indoor visitation and communal dining are paused for independent living at this time. Surveillance testing will continue.

August 20, 2021 – Aberdeen Heights announces a non-direct resident care employee has tested positive for the virus. The employee last worked on August 18. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue.

August 20, 2021 – Arkansas City Presbyterian Manor announces three residents and an essential health care employee have tested positive for the virus. The residents, all memory care, will recuperate in isolation and be cared for by designated staff. The employee last worked on August 13. The health department has been notified and visitation is suspended at this time. Surveillance testing will continue.

August 18, 2021 – President Joe Biden announces that "nursing homes" receiving Medicare and Medicaid funds will have to have 100-percent of their staff vaccinated to continue to receive those funds.

August 16, 2021 – Heart and Soul Hospice announces a non-direct patient care employee has tested positive for the virus. The employee last worked on August 13.

August 13, 2021 – Arkansas City Presbyterian Manor announces that an essential health care worker and a memory care resident have tested positive for the virus. The employee last worked on August 13. The health department has been notified and visitation is suspended for all memory care residents. Surveillance testing will continue.

August 13, 2021 – Aberdeen Heights announces an essential health care worker and a non-direct resident care employee have tested positive for the virus. The employees last worked on July 10 and August 7. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue.

August 13, 2021 – Fort Scott Presbyterian Village announces a non-direct resident care employee has tested positive for the virus. The employee last worked on August 8. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue. Indoor visitation remains suspended at this time, along with patio visits.

August 13, 2021 – Salina Presbyterian Manor announces one health care resident, one independent living resident and one essential health care worker have tested positive for the virus. The residents will recover in isolation and their residence, respectively, and be cared for as needed by designated staff. All visitation in memory care, assisted living and health care, as well as independent living visitation, remains suspended at this time. Surveillance testing will continue.

August 13, 2021 – Parsons Presbyterian Manor announces a health care resident has tested positive for the virus. The resident will recover at a local hospital, where they tested positive. As a precaution, all health care residents were tested and were negative. Staff surveillance testing will continue.

August 13, 2021 – Lawrence Presbyterian Manor announces an essential health care worker has tested positive for the virus. The employee last worked on August 10. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue. Visitation in health care, along with communal dining and group activities, is suspended at this time.

August 13, 2021 – Farmington Presbyterian Manor announces five employees have tested positive for the virus. The four non-direct care employees and one essential health care worker last worked between August 6 and 10. The health department has been notified and visitation, communal dining and activities are paused at this time. Surveillance testing will continue.

August 6, 2021 – Arkansas City Presbyterian Manor announces a non-direct resident care employee has tested positive for the virus. The employee last worked on August 3. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue.

August 6, 2021 – Salina Presbyterian Manor announces an essential health care worker and an independent living resident have tested positive for the virus. The resident will recuperate in their apartment. The employee last worked on July 29. As a precaution, all visitation in memory care, assisted living and health care are suspended. Indoor visitation in independent living is also suspended. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue.

August 6, 2021 – Topeka Presbyterian Manor announces a health care resident and an essential health care worker have tested positive for the virus. The resident will recuperate in the COVID-19 isolation area, cared for by designated staff. The employee last worked on July 30. The health department has been notified. All visitation, communal dining and activities are suspended at this time. Surveillance testing will continue.

August 6, 2021 – Newton Presbyterian Manor announces a non-direct resident care employee has tested positive for the virus. The employee last worked on July 30. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue.

- **July 23, 2021** Salina Presbyterian Manor reports an essential health care worker has tested positive for the virus. The employee last worked on July 20. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue.
- **July 23, 2021** Parsons Presbyterian Manor reports a contract health care worker has tested positive for the virus. The contract employee last worked on July 1. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue.
- June 25, 2021 Topeka Presbyterian Manor reports an assisted living resident and three essential health care employees have tested positive for the virus. The resident will recuperate in the COVID-19 isolation area, cared for by designated employees. The employees last worked on June 16, 17 and 21, respectively. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue.

- June 14, 2021 Topeka Presbyterian Manor reports an essential health care worker has tested positive for the virus. The employee last worked on June 10. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue.
- **June 6, 2021** Wichita Presbyterian Manor reports one non-direct care resident employee and one third party contractor who provides direct resident care have tested positive for the virus. The employees last worked on May 29 and June 5, respectively. The health department has been notified. Several residents have been quarantined due to close contact. Surveillance testing will continue.
- May 28, 2021 Farmington Presbyterian Manor reports a contract health care worker has tested positive for the virus. The employee last worked on May 25. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue.
- **April 23, 2021** Rolla Presbyterian Manor reports an assisted living memory care resident has tested positive for the virus. The resident will recuperate in the COVID-19 isolation area, cared for by designated employees. The health department has been notified.
- **April 22, 2021** Aberdeen Heights reports a non-direct resident care employee has tested positive for the virus. The employee last worked on April 21. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue.

April 20, 2021 – Newton Presbyterian Manor reports their first COVID case in two months, resulting from surveillance testing. One non-direct resident care employee tested positive for the virus. April 7, 2021 – Manor of the Plains reports their first COVID case since December, resulting from surveillance testing. One non-direct resident care employee tested positive. The employee last worked on April 6. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue.

April 6, 2021 – Wichita Presbyterian Manor reports one essential health care worker and one non-direct resident care employee have tested positive for the virus. Both employees last worked on April 6. The health department has been notified. Visitation is suspended in assisted living and health care until outbreak testing can be done.

March 11, 2021 – PMMA releases new guidance for all campuses for visitation based on the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) guidance released on March 10, 2021. Guidance opened up visitation to residents in every level of living no matter what the county positivity rate is for COVID-19 testing. Outdoor visitation remains preferred for all residents.

March 10, 2021 – Emporia Presbyterian Manor reports an essential health care worker has tested positive for the virus. The employee last worked on March 7. The health department has been notified and surveillance testing will continue.

March 10, 2021 – Parsons Presbyterian Manor reports one non-direct resident care employee tested positive March 10. The health department was notified and surveillance testing will continue.

March 5, 2021 – PMMA releases new guidance for independent living resident visitation when residences are under the same roof as licensed care areas including skilled nursing, assisted living and memory care. Guidance allows independent living residents to have two guests at a time in their residences. Communities may determine whether visitors need to schedule in advance based on the ability to track campus visitors and provide screening services.

March 4, 2021 – Emporia Presbyterian Manor reports a health care resident of Emporia Presbyterian Manor who previously tested positive for COVID-19 has passed away.

February 23, 2021 – Wichita Presbyterian Manor reports one essential health care worker in memory care tested positive for the virus during our weekly employee surveillance testing on Monday, February 22. The health department was notified and surveillance testing will continue.

January 30, 2021 – Salina Presbyterian Manor reported one health care resident tested positive for COVID-19 with a rapid point-of-care (POC) test. The resident was tested due to a previously reported exposure risk. Testing will continue for residents and staff.

Two of the residents reported positive test results after exposure to a close contact who tested positive. The third resident tested positive after residents in that area of campus were offered the opportunity to be tested. The residents will recover in their residences until they meet health department guidelines for ending isolation.

January 27, 2021 – Parsons Presbyterian Manor hosted its second COVID-19 vaccine clinic for residents and staff. The campus is participating in the Pharmacy Partnership for Long-Term Care with Walgreens.

In addition, two residents who had suspected contact with previously reported positive cases tested positive for COVID-19. The health department was notified and testing continues for residents and staff.

Contact tracing identified three employees with possible exposure risk, who will quarantine as directed by the Sedgwick County Health Department as a precaution. January 26, 2021 – Aberdeen Heights hosted its first vaccine clinic for independent living residents and employees, with 225 people participating. The campus is participating in the Pharmacy Partnership for Long-Term Care Program with CVS.

January 26, 2021 – Arkansas City Presbyterian Manor reports one memory care resident tested positive for COVID-19 January 25 after an employee tested positive the week prior. Memory care residents will be tested again February 1, and employee surveillance testing will continue as required.

January 26, 2021 – Fort Scott Presbyterian Village reported five residents tested positive for COVID-19 after mass testing at the community. All residents were tested after two residents tested positive with rapid point-of-care tests. The health department was notified and recommended administering standard tests to all residents to confirm diagnoses. Staff testing will continue.

January 25, 2021 – Aberdeen Village reports an essential health care worker has tested positive for the virus via rapid point-of-care (POC) testing. The Johnson County Health Department was notified. Mass testing will continue as required.

January 25, 2021 – Fort Scott Presbyterian Village reported an essential health care worker tested positive for COVID-19. The Bourbon County Health department was notified and three residents with possible contact were quarantined per health department recommendations. Staff testing continues.

January 25, 2021 – Salina Presbyterian Manor reported one health care resident and one essential health care worker have tested positive for COVID-19. The health department was notified and testing continues for staff and residents.

In addition, two health care residents, who were tested due to exhibiting signs and symptoms of the virus, have tested positive. The health department was notified and testing will continue for residents and staff.

January 22, 2021 – Wichita Presbyterian Manor had its first COVID-19 vaccine clinic for staff and residents with 262 people participating. The campus is participating in the Pharmacy Partnership for Long-Term Care Program with CVS.

In addition to those receiving their second dose of the vaccine, an additional 42 people received a first dose of the vaccine.
