Topeka Presbyterian Manor celebrates renovation with ribbon-cutting

TOPEKA, Kan. – Topeka Presbyterian Manor will celebrate the opening of its new entrance, assisted living dining room, and renovated library with a ribbon cutting ceremony at 1 p.m. Jan. 27 via Facebook Live.

The refurbished spaces are part of a \$1.6 million renovation to the senior living community's 17-acre campus. Harbin Construction, a multi-discipline general contracting firm, began work on the project in January of 2020.
