Demolition works

August 2020

About the works

On behalf of the Department of Transport and Main Roads demolition work will start at the former service station site at 1827 Gold Coast Highway, Burleigh Heads.

The Queensland Government is keeping work flowing for the GCLR3 project and others like it, by investing in the community during this difficult period.

The GCLR3 extension is set to support up to 760 jobs at a time when maintaining jobs has never been more critical.

Timeframes

The demolition works are scheduled to start from 24 August 2020 and should take about four months to complete.

The cleared site will be used for widening of the Gold Coast Highway for the Burleigh Heads light rail station, a bus connection and footpath.

Expected impacts

The site has been fenced and you may notice construction vehicles and equipment movement around the site.

Pedestrian access will be maintained outside the site, however some minor short-term changes to pedestrian routes may occur.

Some impacts should be expected including:

- Noise from:
 - Excavators, hydraulic hammers and grabs, shears and cutting equipment
 - Reversing alarms used on all machinery and vehicles for safety
 - Loading of trucks
 - Construction vehicles and workers in the area.

While every effort will be taken to minimise impacts, some minor disturbance is unavoidable.

We thank you for your patience and understanding.

All contractors engaged in light rail preparation works are required to provide a COVID-19 plan outlining social distancing and other protective measures for their workers and the community.

It is important to note that in the event of wet weather or unforeseen circumstances, this may impact or delay the work schedule.
