

MASK REQUIRED

BY STATE DIRECTIVE FROM THE GOVERNOR

Face coverings are now required for all Montana counties with 4 or more active Covid-19 cases. This is in effect for all indoor businesses and outdoor activities of 50 or more where social distancing cannot be maintained.

REQUIREMENT All businesses, government offices, and other indoor spaces open to the public must require employees, contractors, volunteers, customers and other members of the public to wear a face covering that covers their mouth and nose while remaining in these spaces. Face coverings are also required at organized outdoor activities of 50 or more where social distancing cannot be maintained.

EXEMPTIONS Exemptions include children under 5, while eating and drinking at businesses that sell food or drinks, during activities where face coverings would be unsafe (such as strenuous physical exercise or swimming), while giving speeches or performances in front of a socially distanced audience, while communicating with someone who is hearing impaired, while temporarily removing their face covering for identification purposes, while receiving medical care, or for people with a preexisting medical condition that would make wearing a covering unsafe.

ENFORCEMENT Businesses, other indoor spaces open to the public and sponsors of organized outdoor activities may deny entry, refuse service, or ask any person to leave if they refuse to wear a face covering. If necessary, peace officers may enforce trespassing laws if a person refuses to wear a face covering and refuses to leave the premises.

ALL POINTS OF ENTRY OPEN TO THE PUBLIC MUST HAVE A CLEARLY VISIBLE SIGN POSTED STATING: "MASK OR FACE COVERING USE REQUIRED FOR AGES FIVE AND OLDER."
