## MASTER EDUCATOR

### A Development Level Course in the Trainer Pathway



The Oceania Sport Education Programme (OSEP) is an initiative of the Oceania National Olympic Committee. It is designed to develop sport education in the Pacific region with National Olympic Committees, Regional Sports Federations in Oceania and their member national Federations.

The OSEP comprises a number of training programmes that have been specifically designed to provide a regional approach to sport education by developing flexible, relevant, modern curricula. The programme underwent an external, independent evaluation which involved several layers of stakeholder consultations, compilation of findings, recommendations, validation with stakeholders before moving into a new strategy and direction. At its core, the courses remain the same.

The courses are in five streams targeting community, development and national level sport volunteers and paid professionals:

1. Administration
2. Coaching
3. Strength and Conditioning Coaching
4. Team management
5. Trainer

### COURSE FACILITATORS

To support the development level training programme, specially trained and accredited facilitators will help to ensure training is delivered to a high standard and all course participants are competent in the course they are undertaking.

The OSEP Master Educator Training Programme is designed to equip participants with the necessary skills to present and assess OSEP development programs for which they possess the relevant technical knowledge and skills.

### PREREQUISITES

To qualify for this course, the applicant should:

- have an existing interest or strength in an existing sport, physical activity, or physical education in general
- have participated and worked in the chosen area of interest
- completed courses under the OSEP streams

OR

- strong recommendations from existing NOC or national and regional federations

### LEARNING OUTCOMES

Upon successful completion of the OSEP Master Educator Training Programme, participants will be able to:

- Plan and facilitate OSEP Educator Course
- Assess OSEP Educators observation and feedback skills
- Identify continuous professional development areas
- Deliver OSEP Development level course
- Support and review training with the OSEP course coordinator

### DURATION

The OSEP Master Educator Training Programme will take approximately 16 hours in duration plus post course requirements in workplace assessment for accreditation, delivered in a face-to-face practical environment by accredited OSEP Mentors.

## **POST-COURSE REQUIREMENTS**

Co-facilitate relevant courses from the relevant specialised stream of the participant ie Coaching (Development Coach) or Strength and Conditioning (Community Strength and Conditioning Coach, Development Strength and Conditioning Coach) or Administration (Management in Sporting Organisations) one year of completing the OSEP Master Educator Course

OR

If partner organisations engage with OSEP for this course, the trainee OSEP Master Educator must deliver the course or program of the partner organisation within one year of completing the OSEP Master Educator Course.
