Who is at risk of skin tears?

Skin tears can arise in elderly patients with fragile skin, or those people who are reliant upon support and as such, are considered to be at a **higher risk** of sustaining skin tears.²

Skin tears have been associated with many different events such as trauma, getting in and out of bed, knocking against furniture and falls, as well as handling and equipment injuries.² There are a number of **risk factors** and these can include:



Assessment of skin tears

A thorough assessment of the risk factors for skin tears should be conducted, and in addition to understanding the factors that contributed to the development of a skin tear, the cause of injury must always be established, ie. when, where and how it occurred.

Before initiating any treatment, the first step is to assess the wound or skin flap and determine the type/category of skin tear using a validated documentation system (such as the iSTAP classification system³) in accordance with your local clinical protocol.



Skin tear management with iSTAP* classification tool



Correctly identify on first presentation.

- Control superficial bleeding.
- Select appropriate cleanser.
- Gently clean wound bed.
- Align skin flap and classify according to iSTAP classification system (measure and document).
- Use T.I.M.E. clinical decision support tool to set goals of treatment (refer to T.I.M.E. CDST).
- Mark the dressing with an arrow to indicate correct direction of removal.



- Consider limb protector (CoolFAST™ Tubular Retention Bandage).
- Consider limb support (CoolGRIP™ Tubular Support) if clinically indicated.
- Use peri-wound protection and moisturise 2x/day with SECURA[◊] Moisturising Lotion.
- Implement risk reduction tool from iSTAP guidelines.



Gentle silicone foam dressing that provides a moist wound healing environment

To mark an arrow on the dressing to indicate the correct direction of removal



Stop the bleeding and clean

- Control superficial bleeding.
- Select appropriate cleanser.
- Gently clean wound bed.

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Skin tear management with iSTAP*

Tissue alignment

• Align skin flap and classify according to iSTAP classification system (measure and document).



Type 1No skin loss. Flap can be repositioned.



Type 2Partial flap loss. Flap will not fully cover wound bed.



Type 3Total flap loss. Exposing entire wound bed.
