Do you have water quality concerns? Are stream banks eroding? Do you have unproductive land?

We can help by providing technical assistance and cost shares to establish riparian areas.

Riparian area refers to land next to streams and rivers, and includes vegetation that helps contribute to shade, cover, wood, and nutrients. It is important to have a healthy riparian area because it can help cool water temperatures and provide cover for fish species. Conserving fish and wildlife habitat, such as through riparian plantings, helps maintain clean air and water, control pests, moderate climate, and reduce erosion. Conserving habitat also supports farming such as through establishing plants that support pollinators and healthy soils and by reducing noxious weeds.
