

Course Title: Humanities 3

Description:

The humanities series of classes are designed to give students the opportunity to study and discuss world history with a biblical worldview plus so much more. This class will allow students to experience history through literature, geography, and the arts. Intended to meet the requirements for middle school literature as well as social studies, this course integrates various activities, projects, and subjects to help history come to life! Middle school students are still developing their faith and opinions about the world around them. The in-class instruction and discussions are designed to help students recognize valuable lessons through the study of mankind's successes and failures. The objective of this course is for students to see the hand of God throughout history and to identify the need of Christ in all people and in all nations.

In Humanities 3 students will dive into the art, music, literature, science, and philosophy of the mid-15th – early 18th century world. Covering the Renaissance, the Reformation, world exploration, and early American history, Volume III of the Mystery of History series introduces students to famous characters and events in this exciting period of history. The tutor will incorporate literature that will enrich and broaden interest in the era. Students will work daily on at-home assignments and readings. Hands-on learning through maps and activities will also be included.
