1. FULL MEMBER - Full Year no restrictions

\$830 per year. There are no restrictions and no additional costs to play other than the standard entry fees that apply to all members

Instalment Option – 12 instalments of \$77 each. First instalment due 1st April
then monthly payments. Arrangements can be made with the Secretary.

2. SOCIAL MEMBERSHIP - Full year restricted

\$260 per year. This membership provides an entry level for new members or those players unable to play regularly in competitions due to other commitments or for personal reasons. These members are unable to vote and are free to play when the course is open with the following restrictions:

- Unable to play during club competition times (Wednesday, Thursday and Saturday) unless playing with a Full Member, and must pay a Green Fee and, should they wish to vie for the prizes and record Golf Link Handicapping, they must also pay the standard competition fee before teeing off.
- · Unable to play in Club Championships

3. SUMMER MEMBERSHIP - Half year restricted

(October - March, actual dates to be confirmed)

\$465 per year. Extending from the opening and closing of the summer program. This caters for the players who want to play regularly in summer however are unable to do so in winter. There are no restrictions during the summer program or additional fees other than the normal competition entry fees as per full members.

Message to Members

To know the Rules and observe the Etiquette of Golf is not only a tribute to you, but also to the Club to which you belong.

Your enjoyment and the enjoyment of others is often impaired by a selfish disregard or lack of knowledge of one or both of these most important principles.

SCORES CARDS: Each player, as soon as practicable after competition of a round, must ensure their card is put in the competition box. It is the responsibility of all players that their name and correct handicap are clearly shown on the card as well and that the correct score is recorded for each hole and the card is signed and counter signed.

SLOW PLAY: Please follow these time saving measures:

- Walk immediately to your ball and play if there is no danger of personal injury.
- Always play your own ball before looking for a fellow competitor's ball.
- If waiting for the group in front, use this time to make club selection and practice swings.
- When reaching the green leave your bag at the side handily placed for movement to the next tee.
- · Player with the honour must mark card after teeing off.

Players habitually offending by slow play can be penalised two strokes by the Match Committee.

Under the Rules you are obliged to report (in writing) any breaches of the Rules of Golf you may observe to your Match Committee for its action.

The Committee reserves the right to make any alterations to the printed programme and to vary playing rights of members from time to time.

PRACTICE AREAS: Putting only on practice greens. Chipping to practice putting green allowed within defined area. Driving Range available – please observe rules as posted with regard to use of club or own balls.

BUGGIES AND STORAGE: Club storage is available through the Club Management for an annual fee. All stored at own risk.

COMPLAINTS: Any complaints regarding Club Employees must not be made to employee concerned but made in writing to the Committee.

PLEASE CARE FOR OUR COURSE: Players are requested to carry a sand bucket to fill all divot holes. Please rake bunkers and repair pitch marks on greens.

DRESS REQUIREMENTS

CLUB SHIRT: White with club logo.

GENERAL: Members and their guests are expected to present themselves neatly and suitably attired, both on the course and in the Club House and surrounds. Members are responsible for the dress and behaviour of their quests.

ON THE COURSE: Golf shoes with metal spikes are not permitted. Clothing must not display offensive slogans or pronounced advertising. Shorts (not athletic or football) may be worn with either sports socks, anklet or knee high socks.

NOT PERMITTED: Track/Leisure suits, singlet, tank tops, thongs, ripple soled or basketball style boots, sandals, casual t-shirts, athletic or football shorts.

INTER CLUB COMPETITIONS: Preferably club uniform or as stipulated for 'On Course' attire. Must meet dress code of other clubs visited.

Denim clothing in excellent condition (no holes or tears) may be worn on the course and in the clubhouse.

CLUB HOUSE: Neat casual dress at all times.

New members

Please welcome all new members to our Club as they will ensure our future growth.

It is the responsibility of the Proposer and Seconder immediately the nominee is elected to Membership to see that such new Member is introduced to other Members, is advised of all rules governing the conduct of the Club and above all is sufficiently advanced in the knowledge of the Rules of Golf to be competent to perform in the duty of marker of a fellow competitor. Please see that you play with your Nominee until he or she is so equipped. New members with Handicaps from other Clubs must have their handicaps verified by the Handicapper before they are eligible to participate in competitions.

Local rules

Out of Bounds: Grounds outside the Club Boundary fence. Rule 18. Players may drop without penalty a ball lying against or on stone or lying on an ant nest. A ball lying within the defined car park area must be lifted and dropped within one club length of the nearest point of relief avoiding the Clubhouse, outbuildings and vehicles and not nearer the hole without penalty.

Staked trees or shrubs shall be treated as immovable obstructions. Relief obtained under Rule 16.

Penalty for breach of Local Rules are posted on the Notice Board.

General Conditions of Play

Where dates are fixed by Match Committee for play for Club Trophy events, members must play or forfeit.

All competitors are under the control of the Match Committee which reserves the right to change, alter the date of, cancel or vary any competition.

Competition competitors have the right of way on the course at all times.

In both scratch match play and handicap match play events, in the event of a match being square after 18 holes, the match shall be continued, hole by hole, until a result is reached.

Members are asked to refrain from practising on the course proper with more than two balls.

Motorised carts are permitted with the exception of Club Championships and Open Championships unless approved for medical reasons.

ONLY FINANCIAL MEMBERS ARE ELIGIBLE TO PLAY IN CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP EVENTS.

(This includes members paying by monthly instalments.)

Members Competitions and Conditions

PLEASE ENSURE ALL MATCH PLAY ROUNDS ARE PLAYED BY THE SPECIFIED TIME.

IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO ARRANGE MATCHES.

DISQUALIFICATION RULE WILL APPLY.

PRESIDENT'S TROPHY: Mixed Canadian Foursomes played in conjunction with Opening Day. 1/2 combined handicap.

MONTHLY MEDALS. First Saturday in each Month. Stroke

CAPTAIN'S AND VICE CAPTAIN'S TROPHIES: 18 Hole stroke. 4 pairs to qualify in A, B and C Grades. Followed by Match Play.

DAVID SCHINCKEL MEMORIAL TROPHY: Stroke Round, Best Nett score for the day. One Grade.

CLUB AMBROSE PAIRS: Championship and Handicap. Drawn Event.

M.H. MONFRIES TROPHY: Aggregate of four best Stableford scores from five rounds.

VICE PRESIDENT'S TROPHY: 36 Hole Stroke Handicap. One Grade.

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS AND P.A. LEARMONTH CUP: 4 Qualifying Rounds (2 nominated rounds to count). 8 to qualify in A, B, C and D Grades followed by Match Play in Quarters, Semis and Finals.

OPEN CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP: Recognition on Honour Board.

VETERANS HANDICAP CHAMPIONSHIP:

Played in conjunction with qualifying rounds of Club Championships. Players must be over the age of 60 as at the date of the event.

All the conditions of play to be known before the FIRST qualifying round begins.

B Grade players are to have the choice of playing either in the Championship or their own grade, if their score is in the top eight. Players who do not intend to qualify in the Club Championships do not play in the qualifying rounds.

All competitors are under the control of the Match Committee which reserves the right to change, alter any date, cancel or vary any competition. Any reduction in handicap during the qualifying rounds will not effect division.

PRESIDENT'S TROPHY:

A and B four ball best ball Stableford.

PATRON'S TROPHY:

Stableford competition, best score, A Division, B Division.

HANDICAP MANAGER'S TROPHY:

Best 8 aggregate nett scores taken on best stroke rounds played in Wednesday Competitions.

Golf SA (Women's):

Most Wednesdays played in Winter Season.

VETERAN'S TROPHY (Age 55 years & over):

This trophy is given for the best three aggregate nett scores of the five monthly medal rounds. A special trophy is given for the best nett score returned by a lady member over 60 during the play of the Veteran's Event (Super Veteran).

PUTTING COMPETITION:

To run in conjunction with the five monthly medal rounds.

N.G.C. SILVER SPOONS:

Two Divisions: Silver and Bronze. Taken from results of monthly medal rounds. Winner in each division receives a spoon. No entry fee.

S.E. MEDALLION:

The Monthly Medal and other Club Events will only be won by our Members. Everyday competitions are open to visitors from other Clubs who have a handicap, pay their green fees and competition fees.

Perpetual Trophy donated by Kerry Ellis. To be given to the lady member who reduces her handicap by the most number of strokes during the winter season.

LADIES HANDICAP CUP:

Best three aggregate nett scores of the Saturday Monthly Medal rounds. Perpetual Trophy donated by Mrs. Joan Dilena.

MARY CUDMORE PERPETUAL TROPHY:

Best four of eight Stableford rounds in A & B Divisions.

INTERNATIONAL BOWL:

Three 18 Hole stroke competitions. Division A & Division B. Entry Fee \$3.00 (paid by the Club) entitles competitors to return cards on current handicap each day. After the final round the best two cards in Silver and Bronze divisions are forwarded to the G.S.A. Prize: International Bowl is held by the Club of the Winner of the Silver Division for six months, then by the Club of the Bronze Division winner for a further six months, in conjunction with the International Bowl.

ECLECTIC:

A Grade and B Grade – Handicap limits to be determined by the Match Committee at the commencement of the Winter Season.

Order of Play:

For Wednesday competitions will be indicated on time sheets each week. The starter of the field will authorise the re-allocation of groups in the event of cancellations.

Ties:

All stroke play competitions are decided on a count back over the last nine holes – if a further tie, on the last six, three or one hole.

Match Play competitions: Refer Rule 3.2

Handicap. No player may enter in a competition without a handicap, but she may play in the field and return an Extra Day Score. Each player is responsible for her own handicap which must appear on her score card before it is handed in. Each individual player's handicap must appear on the scorecard in foursomes and four ball events. Players holding temporary handicaps are eligible to compete in minor Club Events, but not in any competitions for which a WGA handicap is required.

NARACOORTE GOLF CLUB INCORPORATED

CONSTITUTION 12th November 2016, Amended

1. NAME:

The name of the club is "NARACOORTE GOLF CLUB INCORPORATED"

2. OBJECTS:

The objects of the Club are:

- 2.1 To provide facilities for the playing of golf and other sports and for recreational and social activities.
- 2.2 To do all things which the Club may consider desirable to promote the game and the playing of golf and the accommodation comfort and recreation of its members including the establishment and maintenance of residential accommodation

3 POWERS:

The powers of the Club are:

- 3.1 To acquire, by purchase lease or otherwise, any property, or interest in property, real or personal, which in the opinion of the Committee may be desirable for use for the purposes of the Club and to dispose of by such means as the Committee may determine any such property or interests therein which may, in the opinion of the Committee, be surplus to the requirements of the Club.
- 3.2 To engage or employ contractors and employees and to remunerate them on such basis as the Committee may consider appropriate.
- 3.3 To promote and to hold either alone or in conjunction with any other association, club or person, golf competitions, matches, and meetings, to give or contribute towards prizes, medals and awards and to give or support all manner of entertainment.
- 3.4 To establish, promote or to assist in the establishment or promotion of, and to subscribe to or become a member or associated or amalgamated with, any other club or association whose objects are complimentary to the objects of the Club or the establishment or promotion of which may be beneficial to the Club.
- 3.5 To invest and deal with the moneys of the Club in such a manner as the Committee may from time to time determine.
- 3.6 To raise money either with or without security on the assets of the Club in such a manner as the Committee may from time to time determine and without limiting the generality of that power by drawing or endorsing negotiable bills of exchange or accepting or making use of discount or other facilities or financial arrangements offered by financiers to extend credit facilities to the Club.
- 3.7 To support and to subscribe to any charitable or public body.
- 3.8 To do such acts and things as may in the opinion of the Committee be conducive to the attainment of any of the objects of the Club.

4 CATEGORY OF MEMBERS:

The Club has members in the following categories:

Life members

Club members

Junior members

Country members

Honorary members

Supernumerary members

Summer members

Social members

5. MEMBERS:

- 5.1 Life Members
- 5.1.1 Life members are those persons who:

 $Held\,the\,category\,of\,Life\,Membership\,on\,the\,adoption\,of\,this\,constitution.$

- Or Being a Club Member in any category has rendered conspicuous service to the Club and is, on the recommendations of the Committee, elected a Life Member of the Club by the Club at a General Meeting. A Life Member shall have all of the privileges of a Club Member but shall not be liable to pay the annual subscription or other charges, levies or calls payable by a Club Member.
- 5.2 Club Members
- 5.2.1 Club members are those persons who:

 $Held\,the\,category\,of\,full\,membership\,on\,the\,adoption\,of\,this\,constitution$

- Or Being the age of 18 years are on application admitted to that category of membership by the Committee and pay the annual subscription and other charges from time to time fixed by the Committee.
- 5.3 Junior Members
- 5.3.1 Junior Members are those persons who:

Held the category of Junior member on the adoption of this constitution

- Or Being under the age of 18 years are on application admitted to that category of membership by the Committee and pay the annual subscription and other charges from time to time fixed by the Committee. Junior members have the same rights as a Club Member.
- 5.4 Country Members

Any person may apply for country membership providing his or her place of residence is 80 kilometres or more from the golf course.

5.4.1 Country members are:

Those members of the Club who were country members on adoption of this constitution and those persons being the age of 18 years are on application admitted to that category of membership by the Committee and pay the annual subscription and other charges from time to time fixed by the Committee.

5.4.2 A country member shall have the same privileges on the course as a Club member.

- 5.5 Honorary Members
- 5.5.1 Distinguished citizens may on the invitation of the Committee be admitted as honorary members of the Club for such occasions as it may determine.
- 5.5.2 An Honorary member shall have all the privileges of a Club member but shall not be liable to pay the annual subscription or any other charges, levies or calls payable by a Club member.
 Only ten such persons may be admitted under this category at any one
 - Only ten such persons may be admitted under this category at any one time.
- 5.6 Social members shall have the use only of the clubhouse facilities and unless otherwise determined by the committee, shall not be entitled to use the course facilities of the club under any circumstances.
- 5.7 Supernumerary Members

Any member who through illness, temporary disablement or absence from the district is unable to use the course may apply for Supernumerary Membership for not less than six months, and if the application be granted he or she may be placed on the list of Supernumerary Members, and shall thereafter pay the same subscription and have the same rights as a Non-playing member. Upon application he or she may revert to Club membership at the current year's subscription, notwithstanding any increase in the number of Club members. The district to be the area within an eighty kilometres radius of the course. Members shall from time to time advise the Secretary of any change of address and all notices posted to them, at their last known address, shall be deemed to have been received.

5.8 Summer Members

Subject to the powers of the Committee to regulate the times for playing on the course, a summer member shall be eligible to play on the course during the summer golf season as defined in the Members program and have the same playing rights as Club members (except for reciprocal rights). Summer members do not have voting rights.

5.8.1 Summer members are:

Those members who are summer members on the adoption of this constitution and those persons being the age of 18 are on application admitted to that category of membership by the Committee and pay the annual subscription and other charges from time to time fixed by the Committee.

- 5.9 Temporary Members
 - On application, the Committee may admit the following persons as Temporary members on such terms and conditions as the committee determines.
- 5.9.1 Persons participating in golf competitions being conducted on the course of the Club under the auspices of the Committee.

- 5.9.2 Members of associations or organizations which have been given permission by a resolution of the Committee of the Club to conduct a tournament on the course of the Club provided that the predominant number of those persons compete in the tournament.
- 5.9.3 Members of golf clubs with which the Club has reciprocal agreements in respect of playing rights.
- 5.9.4 Persons who are permitted to use the golf course of the club and who have paid the appropriate green fee unless otherwise determined by the committee or by the terms of any reciprocal agreement the period of temporary membership of the club shall not exceed one day. The Committee shall have the right at any time to refuse a person admission to temporary membership of the Club or to cancel any temporary membership conferred and shall not be bound to ascribe any reason for doing so. A temporary member shall pay such subscriptions as the Committee determines from time to time.
- 5.10 Other Categories

The Committee shall have the power to create new categories of membership and prescribe rights for these categories.

6. ELECTION OF MEMBERS:

- 6.1 A person may join one category of membership by completing a Membership Application Form. All members shall comply with the terms and conditions applicable to their category of membership set out in these Rules or as fixed from time to time by the Committee.
- 6.2 Every candidate for membership shall be proposed and seconded in the form prescribed by the Committee. The candidate shall be personally known to both proposer and seconder. Only Life Members, Club members or Veteran members may propose or second a nomination
- 6.3 The Secretary shall post on the principal notice board in the Clubhouse the names, addresses, nominated at least 14 days prior to the date of election. A Club member objecting to the election of a candidate may do so in writing to the Secretary/Manager. The grounds of objection shall be disclosed in full.
- 6.4 The election of members shall be by ballot at a duly convened meeting of the Committee. In an election two adverse votes shall defeat a nomination. Not withstanding the provision of Rule 9.4 a member of the Committee may record a vote on a resolution to elect a member by notice in writing to the Secretary if that member intends to be absent from the meeting at which the ballot is conducted.
- 6.5 Should the Committee reject any application for admission the nominators can immediately demand that a ballot of Club & Veteran members of the Club shall determine the applicant's eligibility for membership. The Committee must immediately proceed to conduct such a ballot. A majority vote will admit or reject.

- 6.6 A member may with the approval of the Committee and on such terms as the Committee may determine change the member's classification of membership.
- 6.7 On the election of a new member, the Secretary shall at once give them notice thereof, and shall at the same time furnish them with a copy of the Constitution, rules and regulations of the Club. Every member shall be deemed to agree to be bound by the rules and regulations of the Club, and the payment of subscriptions shall be evidence of such agreement.

7. THE COMMITTEE AND OFFICE BEARERS:

- 7.1 The management of the Club is vested in a committee comprising President, Vice President, Club Captain, Ladies Captain, Treasurer and three ordinary members. All members of the Committee shall be club members or veteran members.
- 7.2 All members of the committee shall hold office for two (2) years.
- 7.3 Immediately before each Annual General Meeting held in a year ending with an odd number, the Club Captain, Treasurer and two (2) ordinary members of the Committee shall retire and shall be eligible for re-election at the same Annual General Meeting.
- 7.4 Immediately before each Annual General Meeting held in a year ending with an even number, the President, Vice-President, Ladies Captain and one (1) ordinary member of the Committee shall retire and shall be eligible for re-election at the same Annual General Meeting.
- 7.5 The ordinary members of the Committee to retire in any year shall be those members who have been longest in office since being elected or last re-elected.
- 7.6 If members of the Committee resign before the expiration of their terms of office, the persons appointed to fill the casual vacancies thereby created shall continue in office until the next Annual General Meeting.
- 7.7 The term of office of a member of the Committee nominated for election as an office bearer shall terminate at the end of the Annual General Meeting at which the election is conducted. If any ordinary Committee member nominates for election as an office bearer that nomination shall enable a vacancy on the Committee to be filled at the Annual General Meeting.
- 7.8 A casual vacancy shall occur in the office of the Committee if the member dies, resigns or without obtaining leave of absence from the Committee absents him/herself for more than three consecutive meetings of the Committee.
- 7.9 The Committee may fill a casual vacancy by the appointment of a Club member.

8 FLECTION OF THE COMMITTEE:

- 8.1 Vacancies on the Committee arising by virtue of the expiry of the term of a member shall be filled at an Annual General Meetina.
- 8.2 A vacancy occasioned by the retirement of a member which has not been filled at an Annual General Meeting by reason of the number of candidates nominating for election being less than the number of vacancies shall be filled by the Committee. A person appointed to fill such vacancy shall hold office until the next Annual General Meeting and on their retirement shall be eligible for re-election.
- 8.3 A candidate for the Committee shall be proposed and seconded by a Club member or Veteran member. The nomination shall be endorsed with the consent of the candidate.
- 8.4 The nomination shall specify the office if any for which the candidate is nominated.
- 8.5 The nomination shall be delivered to the Secretary at least twenty one days before the date set for the election.
- 8.6 A list of candidates shall be forwarded to each Club and Veteran member at least fourteen days before the day set for the election. Candidates who have nominated as office bearers and fail to win that position in the election at the Annual General Meeting may be nominated for the position of an ordinary committee member from the floor of the meeting. On accepting the nomination, that person has the same rights to appointment as a member nominated and listed on the notice of the Annual General Meeting.
- 8.7 If no more persons are nominated for any office than there are vacancies the chairman of the Annual General Meeting shall declare such persons duly elected.
- 8.8 If more candidates are nominated than there are vacancies to be filled then an election shall be by ballot. Such ballot shall be subject to the direction of the Chairman. So far as this Constitution does not provide direction, any decision by the Chairman relating to the ballot or the conduct thereof including the interpretation of the Constitution in so far as they relate to the election shall be final and conclusive. The candidate receiving the highest number of votes or the required number of candidates receiving the greatest number of votes shall be elected.
- 8.9 Only Club members and Veteran members whose subscriptions are currently paid shall be eligible to vote in an election.
 - The Chairman shall provide material for recording votes by secret ballot and the appointment of scrutineers and generally matters necessary for the management and control of the ballot.

9 PROCEEDINGS OF THE COMMITTEE:

- 9.1 The Committee shall meet at such times as it may determine but not less frequently than once in each calendar month (except for the month of December) and in the absence of an alternative venue, at the Club house.
- 9.2 If present, the President shall preside at all meetings of the Committee. If the President is absent from a meeting or is for any reason unwilling to act as chairperson of the meeting, the Vice-President shall act as chairperson of the meeting. If both the President and Vice-President are either absent or unwilling to chair a meeting the meeting shall elect a member of the Committee to act as chairperson.
- 9.3 The quorum for all meetings of the Committee is five members present in person.
- 9.4 Each member of the Committee present at a meeting shall have one vote. The chairperson of the meeting shall have a deliberative vote on all questions arising, and in the case of equality of votes, a second or casting vote. A Committee member may vote only if personally present at a meeting of the Committee.
- 9.5 The Secretary shall convene a meeting of the Committee within fourteen days of being requested to do so by any member of the Committee.

10. POWERS OF THE COMMITTEE:

Without derogating from the generality of the powers conferred on the Committee by these rules the following specific powers are conferred on the Committee.

- 10.1 Power to fix entrance fees, annual subscriptions, calls and other charges payable by members and the date or dates by which the same shall be due for payment. Power to remit the payment of any such fees and charges.
- 10.2 Power to regulate standards of conduct and of dress of users of the Clubs facilities, power to discipline members for breaches of etiquette or the rules of golf or for unruly or unseemly conduct on the Club premises and power to suspend or terminate membership in accordance with these Rules where the Committee considers that action to be appropriate in the circumstances.
- 10.3 Power to regulate the conduct of play on the course, and to fix playing times especially affecting members of different categories of membership.
- 10.4 Power to enter into contracts in which a member of the Club or member of the Committee may have financial interest provided that: the Committee shall not enter into any contract for the provision of goods or services in which a member of the Committee has a financial interest unless that member discloses the nature of that interest, and no member of the Committee shall vote on any resolution relating to a contract in which that member has a financial interest.

- 10.5 Power to grant an indemnity against all the assets of the Club in favour of members of the Committee in respect of all contracts and engagements bona fide entered into on behalf of the Club.
- 10.6 Power to reimburse any member of the Committee for any out of pocket expenses incurred by the person in connection with the discharge of duties as a member of the Committee.
- 10.7 Power to interpret these rules in a manner binding on the members of every category in circumstances of conflict or of doubt as to their correct meaning.
- 10.8 All acts done at any meeting of the Committee shall not withstanding that it is afterwards discovered that there was some defect in the appointment of the Committee or any member was disqualified be as valid as if every such member had been properly appointed and was qualified to act on that committee.
- 10.9 Alterations to the golf course can only proceed with the majority approval of the Committee, providing this does not include the redesign of any golf hole or green. Alterations to existing green or redesign of a golf hole can only be made on the recommendation of a golf architect approved by either Golf South Australia or Golf Victoria.

11. SUB COMMITTEES:

The Committee may from time to time delegate to such sub committees as it may appoint such of its powers and authorities as it may from time to time determine.

- 11.1 A sub committee appointed pursuant to the preceding rule may, but need not necessarily be comprised of members of the Committee.
- 11.2 The operations and functions of all sub-committees appointed pursuant to this rule shall be governed by procedures approved by the Committee from time to time.

12 GENERAL MEETINGS AND PROCEDURES:

- 12.1 The Annual General Meeting of the Club shall be held at the Clubhouse, between the end of the winter season of golf, i.e. 30th September and the 31st December in each year, at such time as the Committee may determine.
- 12.2 If present, the President shall preside at all general meetings. If the President is absent or is for any reason unwilling to act as chair at the meeting the Vice President, if present shall do so. If neither the President nor the Vice President are willing to chair a meeting the meeting shall elect a member of the Committee to chair the meeting.

- 12.3 The business of each Annual General Meeting shall be:
 - To receive a report from the Committee, an audited statement of income and expenditure and balance sheet for the year ended thirtieth of June and an auditor's report thereon.
 - 2. To elect office bearers and members of the Committee.
 - 3. To appoint an auditor.
 - 4. To deal with any item of special business.
- 12.4 Special business at an Annual General Meeting shall be that business in respect of which notice of intention to raise the same has been given by a Club member or Veteran member to the Secretary at least twenty eight days before the date set for the AGM.
- 12.5 The notice of meeting shall contain details of any item of special business, notice of which has been given to the Secretary.
- 12.6 Notice of all general meetings shall be given only to Club and Veteran members. The notice of every general meeting shall from the date of its dispatch to members until the date of the meeting be posted on the principal notice board in the Clubhouse.
- 12.7 A Special General Meeting may be convened by direction of the Committee and shall be convened within fourteen days of the receipt of a requisition signed by not less than fifteen Club or Veteran members specifying the subject matter for discussion at the meeting.
- 12.8 Fourteen clear days' notice at the least shall be given of every general meeting of the Club.
- 12.9 No business shall be transacted at a Special General Meeting except that of which notice has been given as aforesaid.
- 12.10 The quorum for any general meeting is thirty Club or Veteran members whose subscriptions are currently paid and only such financial members shall have the right to attend or vote at a general meeting.
- 12.11 All decisions of a general meeting shall be determined by a majority of votes except where under this Constitution some other majority is required. The chairperson of every general meeting shall have a deliberative vote and in the case of equality of votes a second or casting vote.
- 12.12 No business shall be transacted at any meeting unless a quorum is present.
- 12.13 If within thirty minutes from the time appointed for the meeting a quorum is not present the meeting if convened upon requisition of members shall be dissolved. In any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the week following at the same time and place and if at the adjourned meeting a quorum is not present within thirty minutes from the time appointed for the meeting the members present shall in the case of an adjourned Annual General Meeting form a quorum but in any other case the meeting shall be dissolved. The chairperson may with the consent of the meeting adjourn any meeting from time to time but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place.

13. MANAGER (SECRETARY/MANAGER):

A Manager of the Club may be appointed by the Committee upon such terms and conditions the Committee shall from time to time think fit.

14. AUDITOR:

There shall be an auditor.

- 14.1 The auditor shall, if required by law, be a registered company auditor at the time of his nomination and appointment. The auditor shall not be a member of the Committee but may be a member of the Club.
- 14.2 The auditor shall audit the accounts of the Club and shall have full access to all of the books, paper accounts and documents relating to the affairs of the Club for the purpose of the conduct of the audit. The auditor shall report to the Annual General Meeting on the accounts of the Club submitted to that meeting.
- 14.3 The remuneration of the auditor shall be determined by the Committee.
- 14.4 The Committee shall have the power to fill any vacancy in the office of auditor resulting from the death, resignation or loss of qualification of the auditor.

15. HONORARY PATRON:

There may be an Honorary Patron or Patrons.

- 15.1 The incumbent President may consult with any member, approved beforehand by the Committee, to hold the position of Honorary Patron.
- 15.2 The term is to be an annual appointment.
- 15.3 The Honorary Patron shall have all the privileges of a club member but shall not be liable to pay the annual subscription or other charges, levies or calls payable by a club member.

16. TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP:

- 16.1 A member may resign at any time. A member who resigns shall remain liable after the date of his resignation for the payment of any debts due to the Club including unpaid entrance fees, subscriptions, charges and levies at the time of resignation.
- 16.2 If a member:
 - (a) becomes bankrupt, or
 - (b) is in breach of his obligations under these Rules, or
 - (c) in the opinion of the Committee so behaves as to render it no longer to be in the interests of the Club for that person to remain a member, the Committee may by resolution terminate that member's membership.

- 16.2 No person's membership shall be terminated unless:
 - The Committee shall have given the member, with not less than seven days prior notice in writing, an opportunity either in person or in writing to explain the conduct considered by the Committee as providing grounds to terminate membership.
 - Special notice of the intended resolution to terminate the membership is given in the notice convening the meeting of the Committee at which it is proposed to consider the resolution.
 - 3. The resolution to terminate the membership is approved by an absolute majority of the Committee.

17. FEES AND SUBSCRIPTIONS:

The financial year of the Club ends on the thirtieth of June.

- 17.1 All subscriptions shall be due and payable on the first day of April or as determined by the Committee from time to time.
- 17.2 A member tendering a resignation after the thirtieth of September in any year shall remain liable for the annual subscription due in respect of the year commencing the first of January immediately preceding.
- 17.3 If a member is in arrears for more than eight weeks in payment of any monies due to the Club on any account whatsoever then:
 - (a) That member shall not be eligible to play in any competition on the Club's course.
 - (b) The Committee may suspend the member from otherwise using the course and facilities of the Club until that member has paid all debts owed by the member of the Club.

18. SEAL:

The seal of the Club shall be under the control of the Committee and shall be affixed to a document only with the approval of the Committee. The seal shall be affixed in the presence of one member of the Committee and the Secretary or such other persons as may be appointed from time to time by the Committee to countersign any documents to which the Seal is affixed.

19 CHANGE TO CONSTITUTION OR RULES:

This Constitution shall be amended by a resolution of a General Meeting of the club and approved by a majority not less than two thirds of the Club and Veteran members present and voting on the resolution.

20. WINDING UP:

The Club shall only be wound up by a resolution of a Special General Meeting of the Club convened solely for the purpose of considering a resolution that the Club be wound up. The resolution shall be passed by not less than thirty members in person present and voting and the number of members voting in favour of the resolution shall be a majoritu of three quarters of the members present and voting on the resolution. On the winding up of the Club any surplus assets remaining after paying all the liabilities of the Club and the expenses of the winding up shall be applied for such one or more purposes promoting or advancing the sport of golf and the playing of golf which the Committee of the Club at the time the resolution to wind up is passed may determine. If the Committee shall not make a determination within one calendar month of the date on which the Club is wound up then the surplus assets or so much of the surplus assets as are not subject to a determination shall be applied for such charitable purposes in South Australia as the Attorneu General for South Australia may direct.

21. ADDRESSES OF MEMBERS NOTICES ETC.:

- 21.1 Every member shall advise the Club of an address to which communications from the Club may be sent.
- 21.2 A notice sent by post to a member at the address appearing in the register of addresses at the Club shall be deemed served twenty four hours from the time of posting irrespective of whether or not the same is received by the member.
- 21.3 No meeting of the Club or action of the Committee shall be deemed invalid by reason that a member of the Committee or of the Club has not received any notice convening a meeting of the Committee or a meeting of members as the case may be.

22. SPECIAL OUALIFYING RULES:

- 22.1 If on the adoption of these Rules, the Club is the holder of a Club License or a restricted Club License granted under the Liquor Licensing Act 1985, then this Rule shall have effect from the adoption of these Rules.
- 22.2 If on the adoption of these Rules this Rule shall apply upon the Club lodging with appropriate licensing authority an application for a Restricted Club License under the Liquor Licensing Act 1985 as amended.
- 22.3 Notwithstanding any other provision of these Rules the aggregate number of honorary members and temporary members at any time shall not exceed in number fifty percent of the aggregate number of members of all categories.
