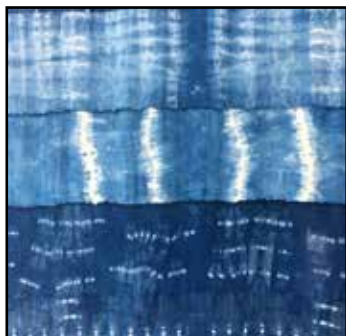

RESIN SILVER-PLATED SPOON PENDANT

In the first two hours, arrange your perfect composition in the spoon using anything you like – an old photograph, beads, crystals, vintage jewelry parts, etc. Bring your own or choose from materials provided. Then 'freeze' your design in resin. In the second class, use glass, vintage beads, crystals and chain to create a necklace using your completed spoon focal.
