

2020 HEIN-FRY BOOK OF FAITH CHALLENGE

HISTORY, VISION AND INVITATION

The Hein-Fry Book of Faith Challenge (HFBFC) seeks to enliven the biblical engagement of the whole church by encouraging the development of faithful, innovative and effective ways of teaching and learning Scripture. The challenge is jointly sponsored by the seminaries of the ELCA, the Hein-Fry Planning Team and the Book of Faith Initiative. Each year, one student from each ELCA-affiliated seminary is invited to create an innovative class, encounter or series for people steeped in biblical texts, as well as those unfamiliar with them, and then report their learnings.

The 2020 HFBFC centers on the theme "The Bible — Word Not Weapon." In our day, citation of the Bible doesn't always reflect God's love. Verses taken out of context can become weapons that discredit others or justify cruel treatment of those different from ourselves. Students were challenged to create a nonthreatening encounter with God's Word that provides a way to gather around that Word in a polarized world and empowers participants to disarm Scripture in their everyday encounters.
